#### From Pastor Doug Stave, Interim

Our son and his family moved to Boston in September, they have lived in New York City and Washington DC before so we were not surprised. We were already planning to go to Ohio to see friends after a wedding in Wisconsin so we simply added Boston. Just a few more miles. Our oldest grand-daughter traveled with us as technical support staff. She was able to navigate much of the trip and mastered the Boston Subway in no time. More than once she overruled my poor sense of direction and kept us on track.

We used Google Maps both when we were driving and walking from place to place. It is an amazing system accessible with most cell phones. Both the big picture and the smallest detail are just a few clicks away. We could map out the whole 2000 mile trip to Boston or find where we needed to walk to get back on the subway just a few blocks away.

Sometimes I wish I had a spiritual "Google Maps". A way to just plug in where I want to go and get a couple of options on how to get there. We do get the big picture, starting with God's claim on us in Baptism (1 Peter 3:21) all the way to the promise of eternal life, (Luke 23:43) but the shorter trips in between are seldom mapped out. What if I take a wrong turn, or like what happened to me in downtown Boston, I could not get in the lane I needed and missed the exit. A mentor helped me with this last summer when I was wondering about these types of things.. His words were simple "wherever you go God will find you" These are not new words, they are in fact very old. The author of Psalm 139 states that there is no where we can go outside of the reach of God.

Somehow Google Maps found us after missing the exit to get to Boston Harbor and got us back to my son's house.. I returned the rental car the next day and just used the subway. We do not get everything mapped out, there are new roads to take and old paths to follow but either way God will find us. There are different ways to get there, planes, trains and automobiles, we did them all. It is with this that we part ways for now each on our own turnpike or prairie trail. Your new pastor will provide "Technical Support" along the way, sometimes called Word and Sacrament ministry. God's word gives us a map, Jesus is the Way, the Truth and the Life( John 14:6.) and calls us to follow. (Matthew 16:24). Alongside this, let the Holy Spirit be your guide. (John 16:13) Your new pastor will know some of the best places to stay, some faster routes and some scenic routes, points of interest and some of the best places to stop and eat along the way. It will be an exciting trip.

May the Spirit guide you.



This Link can be used for a **one time contribution or periodic contributions.** 

You can choose to use your credit card or bank account.

You can designate where you want the contribution to go (Description box). Building fund, General Fund, special contribution.

There is no charge for incorporating this system. The Church is charged only when there is a transaction. The transaction fees are: 2.89% of transaction for credit card transactions, 1.00% of transaction for bank account transactions.

#### Offering envelope discussion

As we discussed at the Sept. 18<sup>th</sup> service, we will be discontinuing the personalized giving envelopes at the end of the year. Several factors led to this decision. They are:

They are expensive, we throw away a lot of them every year as they are not picked up and used.

They create a lot of opportunity for error in the counting process as members use previous year envelopes which have different member numbers and they get inputted unnoticed.

We already get a high percentage of checks in the offering without envelopes with giving designation written on the check.

Generic offering envelopes will be located in the pews for those wanting privacy or giving cash for a designated purpose.

For security purposes, the offering goes directly from the offering plate to a locked vault every Sunday and remains there until the official counting and recording.

We believe this along will the new electronic giving option will improve the entire process.

# Worship & Music Notes

On Sunday, Oct. 2, churches around the world will celebrate something that St. Francis of Assisi started almost 800 years ago: blessing our animals. It was Francis who first introduced the idea that human beings are only one of a myriad of creations of God and all are blessed in God's "eyes." The feast day of St. Francis (the day that he died) is celebrated every year on October 4, and blessing of the animal services are usually scheduled for the Sunday closest to that day.

He is the one who preached to the birds; blessed fish that had been caught, releasing them back into the water; communicated with wolves, brokering an agreement between one famous ferocious wolf and the citizens of a town that were terrified of it and used real animals when he created the very first, live, Christmas nativity scene. As a result of these, Francis is the patron saint of animals and the environment.

St Francis, who founded the Catholic Church's Franciscan order, lived in Italy during the late 12th and 13th centuries. He is remembered for his generosity to the poor and his willingness to minister to the lepers. He is remembered for his love for animals and nature. St Francis died at Portiuncula, Italy on October 4, 1226.

Pope Gregory IX pronounced St Francis a saint in 1228. The pope also laid the foundation stone for the Basilica of St Francis in Assisi, Italy. The church, also known as Basilica of San Francesco d'Assisi, is a UNESCO world heritage site.

The first blessing of the animals happened like this: One warm afternoon early in his ministry (sometime between 1210-15), Francis wandered outside of Assisi, full of self-doubt, asking God if perhaps everything he had done until that point had been for the wrong reasons. Francis wondered if he should have simply gotten married and raised a family as his father wanted him to do. It was while he was praying alone to God that Francis glimpsed some birds along the path. He paused and began to speak to them as if to equals. Soon, he began to "preach" to them about God's glories and all the reasons why both humans and birds should be grateful. That day marks the beginning of the environmental movement, the beginning of the era when we begin to understand ourselves as intrinsically connected to all of creation.

He exhibited a sensitivity to the living and organic things around him that sets him apart from other people of his day and the saints who came before him. He even cared for the inanimate objects of creation with a sensitivity that is similar to Buddhist teachings about kindness toward all sentient beings. One of the most beautiful paragraphs of "The Golden Legend" by Jacobus of Voragine (a late medieval text about the lives of the saints) explains:

The saint would not handle lanterns and candles because he did not want to dim their brightness with his hands. He walked reverently on stones out of respect for him who was called Peter, which means stone. He lifted worms from the road for fear they might be trampled underfoot by passersby. Bees might perish in the cold of winter, so he had honey and fine wines set out for them. He called all animals brothers and sisters. When he looked at the sun, the moon, and the stars, he was filled with inexpressible joy by his love of the Creator and invited them all to love their Creator.

This connection between St. Francis and animals is the single fact about him that most people know. He emphasized that creation includes more than humankind. He always called creatures his brothers and sisters and he worked to further widen the fraternity to link humans and creatures in the same relationship with God. But was Francis really the first person to bless the animals? It appears not. Judaism, long home to blessings of all kinds, may have come first.

#### WATER WORKS: Sawyer Anderson Spoke at First Lutheran

Sawyer is a 13 year old girl from West Fargo, who has written and illustrated a book, *Water Works*. She is the youngest person to partner with Wellspring for the World and World Vision to bring safe, clean water to people in Africa, including some of the most water-impoverished countries in the world.

As a fifth grader in West Fargo, Sawyer Anderson heard about how difficult it is for families in the African nation of Zambia to access clean drinking water. She wrote the book, *Water Works*, hoping to raise money to help them. Sawyer, through the sales of her books and by collaborating with organizations that help financially support the project, has now raised over \$1 million for water wells in Africa! She was recently crowned 2022 International Young American Women of Service for her extraordinary work.
