

Summer Sermon Series: Are the 10 Commandments still valid?

Moses received the 10 Commandments in approximately 1445 BC. It is now 2025, about 3,470 years later. Life has changed drastically from Moses' time. Empires like the Babylonians, Romans, and Ottomans have come and gone. Agriculture, industry, and worldwide economics have developed beyond Moses' wildest imagination. With such revolutionary changes, one must ask: Are the 10 Commandments still valid?

On Pentecost Sunday, we will start a Summer Sermon Series that explores this exact question by looking at the Commandments' original intent and how it applies to today's world. Once we go through the Commandments, we will explore them in relation to the Good Samaritan, the Prodigal Son, and the Lord's Prayer. Each Sermon is stand-alone, so don't worry if you miss worship. 

Lord's Prayer

Have you ever noticed that there are multiple versions of the Lord's Prayer? Some churches omit what is commonly called the Doxology: "For thine is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory, Forever and ever." Another difference is "save us from the time of trial" vs "and lead us not into temptation".

These differences can be traced to different interpretations of the gospel or an attempt to modernize the prayer. Rev John Philip Newell wrote a contemporary paraphrase of The Lord's Prayer called the **Casa Del Sol prayer of Jesus.** It beautifully identifies the universal truth that love is radically inclusive. Read and enjoy!

Ground of all being, Mother of life, Father of the universe, Your name is sacred, beyond speaking.

May we know your presence,
may your longings be our longings in heart and in action.
May there be food for the human family today
and for the whole earth community.

Forgive us the falseness of what we have done as we forgive those who are untrue to us.

Do not forsake us in our time of conflict but lead us into new beginnings.

For the light of life, the vitality of life, and the glory of life are yours now and forever. Amen.



FIRST LUTHERAN CHURCH COUNCIL MINUTES 5-13-25 (Summarized and unapproved.) Approval of April Minutes: M/S. Carried.

Financial Report: Giving has increased in the past two months. Looking at ways to begin paying down the line of credit. As a result of better conservation of electricity by all of us, the bill dropped from about \$1400/month last year to \$1000/month this year! Kudos! The 542 Foundation Gala, Sept. 27, is at First Lutheran. Shoreline will be asked to add First Lutheran as additionally insured in their policy for the event, and provide a certificate of insurance. Report M/S: Carried.

Pastor's Report: In addition to report, she sent topics for discussion: +Bullying: She has raised the concern regarding bullying within the Battle Lake School system to the Network Battle Lake and the Enrollment Team. More information will follow.

- +Operational Funding: need to continue to encourage increased giving to the general (operations) fund in order to sustain our current programming.
- +Future Focus Areas: What are our guiding principles? Where are we going from here? Continue focus on Growing Young. Grow our membership and find ways to involve people in the mission to keep them engaged. More discussion is needed.
- +Results of Congregational Discussion re Where We are Called: Tabled for more info.

Faith Formation Report:An opportunity offered by United Way is a poverty simulation. It is a 3 hour commitment for 40-50 people, to help us better understand the hurdles faced by people trying to climb out of poverty. Possibly open to the community. Ways we might help to eliminate bullying discussed: riding the buses to keep a positive environment, developing a foster grandparent program, reading with students. These will also increase intergenerational involvement and Growing Young.

The playground has not yet been installed; the ground surface still needs to be determined.

NEW BUSINESS

Newsletters: Multiple problems with the mailing of newsletters in recent months. Discussion was held regarding alternatives to mailing to everyone. The consensus was to: 1) Educate the congregation regarding the need for change. 2) Ask for email addresses 3) Make email delivery the primary method of communication. 4) Hand carry newsletters to congregation members living at Good Sam and Lakeview. 5) Mail only to those people who specifically request mailing.

Land Adjacent to FLC: Habitat for Humanity has withdrawn their application for the proposed use of this land. Motion to table discussion of possible land use M/S: Carried. Next Meeting: June 10, 2025 6:30pm
