- Completed stabilized construction entrance at the Peters Mine Pit Area
- Completed silt fence installation in the Peters Mine Pit Area
- Began tree clearing in the Peters Mine Pit Area
- Continued silt fence installation at the O'Connor Disposal Area
- Additional excavation equipment was delivered to the site
- Air and vibration monitoring was performed during the work

Site Background

The 500-acre Ringwood Mines/Landfill site is in a historic iron mining district in the borough of Ringwood in Passaic County, New Jersey where car parts and paint sludge wastes were dumped on the ground and in abandoned mine pits.

EPA originally placed the site on the Superfund program's National Priorities List (NPL) in September 1983. The site was deleted from the NPL in 1994. EPA placed the site on the NPL in 2006 a second time after discovering more contamination. The selected cleanup action for the Peters Mine Pit Area, Cannon Mine Pit Area and the O'Connor Disposal Area is currently being constructed.
