

DISTINGUISHED AMERICAN AWARD DR. ANTHONY DELUISE

Dr Anthony Deluise is the recipient of the 2025 Emo DiNitto/RI Chapter of the National Football Foundation Distinguished American Award. A dedicated physician, community leader, and advocate for excellence in orthopedics, Dr. Anthony M. DeLuise Jr. has spent his career advancing the field of sports medicine, hand and upper extremity surgery, and general orthopedics. With a passion for patient care and a commitment to medical education, Dr. DeLuise has become a trusted name in Rhode Island's medical community.

Born and raised in Providence, Rhode Island, he was a 1993 graduate of Johnston High School where he was an all-division football player and a 1993 Golden Dozen selection the Emo DiNitto/RI Chapter of the National Football Foundation. Dr. DeLuise pursued his

undergraduate education at Boston University, where he graduated magna cum laude with a Bachelor of Arts in Biology and a minor in Economics. His academic excellence earned him membership in Phi Beta Kappa, one of the nation's most prestigious honor societies. He continued his education at Boston University School of Medicine, earning his Doctor of Medicine degree in 2001.

Dr. DeLuise completed his orthopedic surgery residency at Boston Medical Center, where he trained extensively in musculoskeletal care and surgical techniques. To further specialize, he pursued a Hand & Upper Extremity Fellowship at The Philadelphia Hand Center/Thomas Jefferson University Hospital, one of the leading institutions for advanced orthopedic care.

Dr. DeLuise has been a pillar in the orthopedic community. He currently serves as a Hand & Upper Extremity, Sports Medicine, and General Orthopedic Surgeon at Orthopedics RI, where he has been instrumental in expanding services and providing cutting-edge care to patients. Previously, he served as President of Foundry Sports Medicine & Orthopaedics, a division of OrthoRI, from 2007 to 2020. In addition to his clinical work, Dr. DeLuise is a Clinical Assistant Professor in the Department of Family Medicine at Alpert Medical School, Brown University, where he mentors and educates the next generation of physicians.

Throughout his career, Dr. DeLuise has received numerous accolades for his contributions to medicine and the community. He was recognized in Providence Business Weekly's "40 Under 40" in 2014 and was named Leukemia & Lymphoma Society's Man of the Year in 2015 for his outstanding fundraising and advocacy efforts. His commitment to philanthropy extends beyond medicine—he was also honored as the Walk to Cure Arthritis Medical Honoree in 2022. Most recently, his exceptional work has earned him recognition as a Castle Connolly Honoree in 2025.

In addition to his professional accomplishments, Dr. DeLuise has been involved in coaching youth sports in his community since 2013 with the Scituate Tri-Town Football program, FBU all-star football program, Scituate Foster Little League, River Dogs AAU baseball program and the Vipers Flag Football program. For the last three years, Dr, DeLuise has been an assistant football coach at Ponaganset High School, serving as JV head coach in 2022 and the offensive coordinator during the 2023 and 2024 seasons. This past season he helped guide Ponaganset to the Division 3 Super Bowl.

Dr. DeLuise and his wife Monica reside in Scituate, RI with their children Ava and Adrian.

EMO DINITTO CONTRIBUTION TO AMATEUR FOOTBALL AWARD **JOSEPH GILMARTIN**

Joe Gilmartin's legacy in Rhode Island football is defined by passion, dedication, and unwavering commitment to student-athletes and the game itself. A standout player at North Kingstown High School from 1979 to 1981, Joe earned All-Division honors as both a linebacker and kicker before graduating in 1982. His love for football would carry him far beyond the field as a player.

Joe began his coaching career at North Kingstown in 1983-84 under Joe Mancini and continued under Keith Kenyon through 1992. He also served as head coach at Bishop Feehan High School for two seasons before returning to NK in 1995 as an assistant, helping lead the program to two Super Bowl appearances. Joe took a break from coaching to spend time with his children before returning as Head Coach at North Kingstown in 2012.

He transformed the Skippers' football program, guiding the team to the 2017 Division II Super Bowl Championship. Under his leadership, the program was elevated to Division I, where they went on to win backto-back Super Bowl titles in 2018 and 2019. Over his remarkable coaching career, Joe compiled a regular season record of 77-22 and an impressive 10-2 record in playoff games. His excellence on the sidelines earned him Coach of the Year honors three times, including the prestigious Providence Gridiron Club Coach of the Year Award where he also is a Hall of Fame honoree.

Beyond the gridiron, Joe was a beloved and respected history teacher and a devoted multi-sport coach, mentoring student-athletes in football, baseball, hockey, and basketball. His positive impact stretched across generations of students and athletes, and his integrity, mentorship, and love for the game left an indelible mark on the North Kingstown community.

Joe passed away on October 14, 2024. He is lovingly remembered by his wife, Mary Barden, and his three children: Joseph, Theresa, and Benjamin. His legacy lives on through the lives he touched and the program he helped build.
