DISTINGUISHED AMERICAN AWARD JOSEPH MCNAMARA

Rep. Joseph M. McNamara (D) represents District 19 in Warwick and Cranston. First elected in November 1994, he is the chair of the House Education Committee. He also serves as a member of the House Labor Committee and the House Rules Committee.

2023 was a productive session for Representative McNamara, with several education-related bills he sponsored becoming law. He introduced the Hope Scholarship pilot program, which provides the cost of two years of tuition and mandatory fees for eligible students during their junior and senior years at Rhode Island College. He also sponsored a law that improves access to school-based psychological services by including services provided by school social workers and certified school psychologists as health care-related services eligible for federal Medicaid reimbursement. He also introduced a new law that requires the state's public higher education institutions to establish ways of

awarding academic credit for students' participation in registered apprenticeship programs.

Several bills he sponsored in 2022, including four education bills, became law. The first created a joint study commission to examine the governance structure of Rhode Island's public education system. The second allows speech therapy services to be provided in school to children who need them, regardless of age. The third requires the attorney general to publish information on school resource officers. A fourth addresses the unique educational challenges that the COVID-19 pandemic has generated by providing that in developing alternative learning plans, consideration should be given to the unique difficulties and interruptions that many students have experienced because of the COVID-19 pandemic.

Representative McNamara also saw several health-related bills pass in 2022, including one that increases public access to professional psychological services by allowing for telepsychological practice across state lines as well as temporary in-person, face-to-face services in a state where the psychologist is not licensed to practice psychology. Another law creates a way to redistribute unused medication to aid people who cannot access or afford their prescriptions.

In the 2021 session, the General Assembly passed a law sponsored by Representative McNamara to allow school committees to budget funding for school field trips. The new law guarantees that all students have the same ability to attend those trips and allows schools to raise money to supplement the funding.

Representative McNamara is Chairman of the House Education Committee and a member of the Education Commission of the States, a nonpartisan think tank comprising governors, educational commissioners, and legislators from all 50 states. He is a founding board member of College Unbound. He is a board member of Friends of Salter's Grove. He also previously served as an Explorer Advisor for the Boy Scouts of America and the Committee Chairman of Pack 4. Additionally, he is involved with Save The Bay, the Gaspee Day Committee, the Wyman P.T.A., and the Boy Scouts of America, Eagle Scouts.

The Providence Journal named Representative McNamara to the 1968 All-State Football team and he was Captain of Pilgrim High's, 1969 New England Champion Wrestling Team. Representative McNamara is a retired educator, previously serving as the director of the Pawtucket School Department's Alternative Learning Program. He received his Master of Education degree from Providence College. He earned his Bachelor of Science at Boston University and graduated from Pilgrim High School in Warwick.

Representative McNamara was born on September 7, 1950. He is married to Diane and they have two children, William and Katie, and two grandsons.

EMO DINITTO CONTRIBUTION TO AMATEUR FOOTBALL AWARD ARTHUR KERSHAW

Arthur Kershaw was a 1958 graduate of West Warwick High School where he was standout running back and baseball player. He was named to the Providence Journal All-State Football team during his senior year in the fall of 1957 in which he led the state of Rhode Island in scoring. His early years at West Warwick laid the foundation for a remarkable career that would span decades and touch the lives of countless individuals.

Following his graduation, Art continued his academic and athletic pursuits at Boston University, where he continued his football career earning multiple varsity letters.

In 1963, Art began his teaching career with the East Greenwich School Department where he taught science and physical education at the high school. It was here that he began to carve out his legacy, instilling in his students a passion for sports and a dedication to excellence that would endure for generations.

During his thirty-nine years with the East Greenwich School District, his impact was profound and far-reaching. Art also served as a guidance counselor and later as the school's athletic director for fifteen years. Under his leadership in 1999, East Greenwich was honored as the RIIAAA School of the Year.

Art began his coaching career as an assistant under legendary coach Nick Carcieri. As the Head Football Coach his football teams amassed an impressive five Super Bowl wins. In spite of having a school with one of lower enrollments, his teams competed against several of the larger schools for many years with great success. His teams did not only perform on the field at very high level, but they earned several sportsmanship awards including the prestigious Dick Reynolds Sportsmanship Award presented by the Providence Journal.

In addition to his achievements in football, Art also found success as a baseball coach, leading his teams to ten division titles and five appearances in the state finals. In 1969, in his only year as the head wrestling coach, he led the program to a division championship. He is the only coach in the history of East Greenwich High School to win championships in three different sports.

Art's legacy extends far beyond the confines of East Greenwich, as evidenced by his induction into several distinguished Hall of Fames including the West Warwick Athletic Hall of Fame, East Greenwich Athletic Hall of Fame, RI Football Coaches' Hall of Fame, RI Baseball Coaches Hall of Fame, Providence Gridiron Hall of Fame, and RIIL High School Athletics Hall of Fame.

Art and wife Ginnie reside in East Greenwich and have been married for sixty years. They have four children Arthur III (Jimmy), William Kershaw (Billy) Kelly and Beth and they have 7 grandchildren.

FOOTBALL OFFICIAL AWARD KEVIN DEIGNAN

Kevin Deignan was born in Providence and grew up in the Potowomut neighborhood of Warwick. He attended school in Warwick graduating in 1984 from Toll Gate High School. While attending Toll Gate he played football for Coach Emo Dinitto, earning the team's Unsung Hero Award for the 1984 season. Kevin was also a member of the Indoor and Outdoor Track teams.

Kevin attended both URI and CCRI.

Kevin has been involved with football for the last 50 years starting with playing youth football for East Greenwich Pop Warner and then High school and continuing with Officiating.

Kevin joined the Rhode Island Football Association as a Field Judge in 1995. He started as a Referee in 2002 where he stayed until retiring in 2021. Kevin served on several executive boards and was the Association President from 2013-2016.

Kevin worked many Playoffs and several Super Bowls ending his on field career with the Division 1 between North Kingstown and Central in 2021.

In 2014 Kevin was Awarded the Lou Cimini for Outstanding Football Official award by the Providence Gridiron Club. In 2021 Kevin was inducted into the Providence Gridiron's Hall of Fame class.

Kevin currently serves as an executive board member for Emo Dinitto's Rhode Island Football Foundation, Providence Gridiron, Rock-n-Jock Charities, Michaela Lynch Foundation Golf Tournament and is the President of the Fenner Hill Golf Course Innerclub.

Kevin and his wife Laurie have been married for 24 years and have four children, Christopher, Matthew, Allyson and Kelly. They reside in North Kingstown.
