FROM THE DESK OF THE TREASURER



Brothers: After a sluggish start to the year our Portfolio has gradually returned to the positive. At the beginning of the year we changed our strategy to growth increasing the principle investment and take a smaller amount in cash return at the end of the year to \$10,000. This we achieved in April 2024 the total balance of the Valley's investment was \$484,150.41, as of the end of September 2025 the balance is \$569,466.37 an increase of \$85,315.96. We are also expecting a cash return at the end of this year in the range of \$20,000.

Since the beginning of 2021 when we decided to use our investment as income producing revenue instead of investment building we have added \$123,577 to our operating bank account. By doing this we have managed to keep the Dues steady over the last few years and managed to operate in the positive. We have also moved a portion of the cash in our operating account in to a savings account, this has given us the ability to earn additional interest on monies instead of just having it sitting in our operations account. We now have a balance of \$83,284.35.

I want to take the opportunity of thanking you all for allowing me to be the Treasurer of the Valley for the last 8 years. I have decided to step down, allowing another Brother, David Vistica to become the Treasurer of the Valley, David comes with a wealth of experience having served as a Treasurer for a non-profit before coming to SWFL. I wish him well.

To our Perpetual and Life Members: Once again, the Executive Board will be reaching out to you our Perpetual and Life Members of the Valley to voluntary, donate toward the Per Capita Taxes. For those who have donated over the years we thank you and look forward to your continued loyalty and support.




