CONSISTORY MESSAGE FROM THE MASTER OF KADOSH



For this edition of our newsletter, I would like to share with you and article written by Arturo de Hoyos for the Scottish Rite Ritual Monitor and Guide, 3rd Ed.

Meaning of the Scottish Rite Cap

"In the Scottish Rite, the caps [indicate] the consecration of one's physical and spiritual (material and intellectual) attributes to the betterment of humanity. On the one hand, the caps are an inheritance from our chivalric tradition, as similar ones were associated with European Orders of Knighthood, where they evolved from the Arming Bonnet, worn under the helmet. On the other hand, they are also worn as a type of prayer cap, a tradition which also survives in some religions. Thus, the caps are a constant reminder that the physical must be subject to the spiritual and that, like knights, we must valiantly endeavor to maintain honor and virtue by applying the Moral Sense and Reason."

Important Financial Notification from the Executive Board



Brothers: The Executive Board is recommending raising of the 2019 annual dues to \$135.00.

This is due to the Supreme Council's increases in the Per Capita Tax. In 2016 the Valley was notified of the impending increases and given a schedule of the yearly increases.

The Supreme Council scheduled yearly increments of \$2.00 per year through 2021 when the Per Capita will reach \$30.00 per Valley member.

The Valley has endeavored to maintain the Valley's Dues at the current rate of \$125.00 and absorb the increases for the past 8 years.

The Executive Board now realizes the Valley can no longer sustain these Per Capita increases and has determined to increase the annual membership Dues to \$135.00.

To our Perpetual Brothers

The Executive Board would like to reach out to the Perpetual and Life Members of the Valley at this time, who undertook the initiative and prepaid their Valley Dues and Per Capita Taxes. which has been much appreciated over the years.

This last year the Executive Board has cashed in a substantial amount from one of our saving accounts to balance and maintain this current year's operations. The Valley has operated in a negative cash flow and can no longer maintain our operations on the annual membership alone.

For us to maintain the Valley of Fort Myers, the Executive Board is asking the Perpetual Members of the Valley to consider assisting the Valley by contributing at least 50% of the year's Per Capita Taxes. This would be a minimum payment of \$12.00 for 2018, \$13.00 for 2019, \$14.00 for 2020 and \$15.00 for 2021.

A little history of the Per Capita Tax increases and membership:

2002 through 2004 the Per Capita Tax was \$6.00 per member. The Valley membership averaged 1236 members.
2006 through 2009 the Per Capita Tax was raised to \$10.00 per member. The Valley membership averaged 948 members.
2010 & 2011 the Per Capita was \$14.00 per member. The Valley membership averaged 793 members.
2012 the Per Capita Tax was \$16.00 per member. The Valley membership was 752 members.
2013 the Per Capita Tax was \$18.00 per member. The Valley membership was 795 members.
2014 through 2016 the Per Capita Tax was \$20.00 per member. The Valley membership averaged 645 members.
2017 the Per Capita Tax was \$22.00 per member. The Valley membership was 670 members.
2018 the Per Capita Tax is \$24.00 per member. The Valley membership projected at 640 members.

Comparison:

2002 the average Per Capita Tax for the Valley was \$7,416.00 for 1236 members. 2018 the Per Capita Tax for the Valley will be \$15,360.00 for 640 members, of which 305 members are Perpetual Members.

From the Representative of the Scottish Rite Foundation



Being the newly and duly appointed trustee, I come to you for your support and help in achieving our financial goal set by the supreme council of the Scottish Rite foundation of Florida, a 501 (c) (3) organization. The foundation supports 14 Children's clinics in Florida. We have the Johns Hopkins All Children's Hospital here in Ft. Myers.

We are one of 11 valleys in Florida. Our financial goal has been set at \$18,285. For 2018 – 2019. With the number of members in our valley (575) this equates to approximately \$32 a year for each member. However, being

realistic, we know that everyone is not going to contribute. Knowing this to be the case, the Executive Board has determined that we may be able to set up a few formulas for members to choose from that would allow members to adjust their financial budget. See below.

We have 11 months to achieve our goal. We should note at this time, 97% of all Funds donated to the Scottish Rite Foundation's clinics are used to support the children and 3% goes to administrative fees.

As Master Masons, Scottish Rite Members and Shriners, we have an obligation to uphold and assist our fellow man and support medically-challenged children, whatever their needs be. This is what it's all about.

Suggested formulas:

- \$5 per mo. For 11 months = \$55 per yr. X 332 members = \$18,260
- \$10.50 per mo. For 11 months = \$115.50 per yr. X158 members = \$18,249
- \$20 per mo. For 11 months = \$220 per yr. X 83 members = \$18, 260
- \$25 per mo. For 11 months = \$275 per yr. X 67 members = \$18,425

Please step up and commit to a donation of any kind or choose one of the formulas above that mat fit your budget. Please do not wait for someone else to take up the slack that you may have created. Give back what you can afford.
