Hello all. 2019 is about to be started!

From the Representative of the Scottish Rite Foundation



"What's the matter", is a phrase often used to ask someone who seems to be experiencing some type of problem whether it be physical or mental. The definition of matter is anything that has mass and occupies space and takes up volume, i.e. Material stuff, substance which refer to that of which physical objects are composed (though all these terms are used abstractly).

"Matter", as distinct from mind and spirit, is a broad word that applies to anything perceived or known to occupying space.

So, what does it mean when someone asks us, "what's the matter" with you or a problem, etc.? "something's the matter", "nothing's the matter", 'subject matter", "does it really matter"? Phrases commonly spoken and used to ask or talk about someone who seems worried, troubled, unhappy or ill. Maybe there is a situation that seems wrong with a machine or equipment which seems not to be working properly. Maybe something is in one's mind that's troubling that person, whatever it may be.

You may be wondering about now, what the heck is wrong with brother ken? Has he lost it? "what's the matter with him"?

The "matter" of achieving our goal, has entered into my head and my mind and continues to "occupy space". Daily, I ask myself, how do we approach our brethren to assist the Foundation of Florida in further helping support the children 's clinics?

Well, the fact of the "matter" is we are at 23% of our goal of \$18,285 set by the Scottish Rite Foundation of Florida. We are behind in our contributions by not receiving monthly donations as we need be to obtain this year's goal and quota of \$18,285, meaning that we are 77% away from our goal. We need to step up!

Now, "the truth of the matter is", we all need to get to work and raise some donations. No "matter" how small the donations are. Think about this, if 41 of us could get two people to commit just \$20.75 per month for the next 7 months, we would achieve \$14,525. Boom!! We've made our goal. Would you be one of the 41?
