FROM THE DESK OF THE TREASURER



Brothers: 2025 year has started off very sluggishly and slowly, due to the current Stock Markets performance. The optimistic view is we are expecting a turnaround later in the year once the Market decides what and where it is going to go. Other than the slow start of the year with our investments, I can report that the Members have stepped up and paid their dues earlier this year.

We currently have and have been maintaining an average monthly balance in the Valley Operations account of \$70,000.

The Executive Board has taken necessary action to reduce our Per Capita Tax payments to the Supreme Council. Over the past five months we have reviewed our records and identified over 70 Members who are anywhere from 2 to 9 years in arrears.

We are in the process of submitting 49 members to the Orient of Florida and the Supreme Council requesting the suspension of these members as NPD, hence removing them from our Per Capita obligations. On average, this should realize a savings of \$1,600 per year. Once the initial suspension requests have been approved by the Supreme Council and the Orient of Florida, we will undertake and request the suspension of the remaining 20+ members who are in arrears.

I can assure you that every effort has been made by the Secretary, Treasurer, and Personnel Representative to reach out to these members and ascertain the reason for their current situation and to offer solutions to try rectifying their situation.
