FROM THE DESK OF THE TREASURER



2026 Dues Notices will have a new voluntary donation category for JROTC Scholarship.

Under the management and guidance of Bro. Joe McArthur, 32° KSA the Valley of Fort Myers has expanded our support of the JROTC Program from six schools to twenty-six schools.

In an effort to introduce Freemasonry to the members of the JROTC and their parents we decided to introduce a scholarship program. Like most of the other scholarship programs, the JROTC members must have an association with a Masonic organization, the program is open to both male and female member of the JROTC. If the JROTC member does not have such an association at present they can join DeMolay (male) or Rainbow Girls (female). Our intent is to award eight (8) \$1,000 scholarships per year—1 male and 1 female from each of the four counties we serve.





Along with the voluntary donations we are suggesting with your Dues Notices we are planning other events and fundraisers to raise the necessary funds to finance the program. Currently we are selling challenge coins to our members for

\$20 each (right). These are slightly different from the challenge coins we have made for presentation to the JROTC members. We will hold the collected funds in an interest-bearing account until the funds are ready for annual disbursement.






