FROM THE TREASURER



Brothers: I am happy to report that our financial condition has stabilized, and we are maintaining a balanced budget. The good news I have to pass along is that in 2021, Ill. Rick Hoover 33° SGIG of The Orient of Florida, gave the Valleys within the Orient permission to work with Wells Fargo Advisors in reallocating our Perpetual Fund accounts into more aggressive Investments. Based on the SGIG's directive the Executive Board approved the redistribution of the Perpetual Funds, along with a new investment strategy for the Valley's non-Perpetual Fund Investments. This new account was made up by closing the Raymond James investment account as it was not achieving our financial requirements, due to mediocre performance and along with the Executive Board's approval for investing part of the monies from the sale of the Slater Road property. This money was combined creating a new Valley Investment Fund of \$275,000.

The purpose of the reallocation of both investment accounts was to generate an income from the Valley's Investments accounts, Our desired goal was to raise our yearly income return from the Perpetual Fund of \$12,000.00 to \$30,000.00 using both accounts. In July we repositioned our investments with "Wells Fargo Advisors". Maintaining the current Perpetual Fund but in a more aggressive account and opening the Valley Investment account from the combination of Raymond James and the Slater Road Property sale. Since July when the reallocation took place our investment returns through the end of October 2021 are just over \$18,000.00. Which after 10 months in the new investment strategy, has improved by \$6,000.00 over last year,

If the Stock Market maintains this current trend we are anticipating over \$20,000 returns this year. This will relieve the financial pressure on the Valley, which it has been experiencing with the passing of 43 members this year. On the brighter side the Valley has gained 28 new members bringing this current census to 586 members.

As reported last year, this year will see the increase in Per Capita Tax to \$30.00. This will bring our Per Capita Tax for 2021 to approximately \$17,850.00.

To our Perpetual and Life Members: Once again, the Executive Board will be reaching out to you to voluntarily donate toward the Per Capita Taxes. For those who have donated over the years we thank you and look forward to your continued loyalty and support...

A STORY ABOUT YOUR TEAM ACHIEVEMENT

Brethren: Most of you have heard about achieving our Valley's Foundation goal for the fiscal year of 2020-2021. Please allow me to honor you with some facts about what you, as a team for the Valley of Fort Myers achieved, over the past 3 and a half years. All of you, 118 plus donors, should be proud of yourselves. This may be a boring story for some. However, some will take pride in knowing the HUGH accomplishment which the Valley of Fort Myers has

done this past year.

Back 3 and a half years ago, I was "voluntold" to assist the Scottish Rite Foundation of Florida. They appointed me to be the Representative/Trustee for The Valley of Fort Myers. The first year was extremely difficult for me to grasp what was expected of me. The Valley of Fort Myers' donation goals had not shown particularly satisfactory results for the past seven to twelve years. It seemed, to be a very difficult and impossible task to be accomplished. For the first three or four months I toiled, lost sleep, and mulled over what to do to motivate the Fort Myers Valley members. I would lie in bed and think about things to do to raise funds to support the Foundation's number one charity. There came a point where I had convinced myself there was no way to pull this situation out of the hole, so to speak.

One morning, about 2 a. m. while getting a glass of iced tea from the refrigerator I recognized a magnetic door sticker on the fridge of which I have had for over 50 odd years. It states: "THE PERSON WHO SAYS IT CANNOT BE DONE SHOULD NEVER INTER-RUPT THE PERSON DOING IT". I thought to myself, you're a big dummy—you have been talking to yourself all along. If you think "it can't be done", you're correct, it can't be done. However, if you think we can do it, you would be correct again. Maybe, just maybe, it can be done.

So, I thought about it a lot. The Valley needs help so Let's put a team together. I went to the Valley's executive board meeting and asked the members for suggestions. There were a lot of suggestions. Travel to different lodges in the district, corporate donations, pledges, mailouts, golf tournaments, etc. All were great suggestions. Some were difficult to implement at first. But, we landed on mailouts, traveling and pledges mostly in the first two years.

The donations we received for the (2017-2018) year were only \$2,500 so we missed our goal of \$18,200 by \$15,900, only reaching 13% of our goal. The year I was "voluntold" to assist (2018-2019), the donations reached were \$13,280 — our goal was \$18,230, we missed the goal by \$4,848, only achieving 73% of our goal. The year (2019-2020) donations were \$16,549 — our goal was \$18,260, we missed it by \$1,711, reaching 90.5% of our goal. This was just at the Covid lockdown. The year (2020-2021) our donations were \$17,540, our goal was \$15,000, we went over our goal \$2,540, 14.5% over our goal of 100%. Think about this...the previous 4 years (2014-2018) a total of \$17,190 in donations were collected to support our number one charity. The total goal set over those 4 years was \$72,500, that is just 23.7% of a goal that was set over a 4-year period. Yet, over the past 3 years (2018-2021), we received \$47,369 and the total goal set at \$51,490 — we were only \$4,120 short over the last 3 years, an achievement of 92% of a 3-year goal (a little over \$1,373 a year under our goal).

All I can say is THANK YOU, THANK YOU and THANK YOU again for the Children that will benefit from all of you have done to support The Johns Hopkins Children's Hospitals and Clinics.

Let's do it again for the year (2021-2022). Don't forget then lasagna cookoff Nov. 17th, 2021 at the Scottish Rite. It is an open meeting at The Masonic Center 10868 Metro Pkwy at 6:00 p. m.
