Division Director's Report

April 2025

We had successful Division D Speech contest at Messiah Lutheran Church on March 29th. First place for the International Speech Contest was Solomon Asine and second place was Cassandra Drinkard. First place for the Evaluation Contest was Steve Vaccaro and second place was Andrea Taylor. These four will represent Division D at the District Conference on May 10th. We heard a lot of great feedback about how well the contest was executed and how nice and big the venue was – which allowed for great networking for all who attended – nearly 50 people.

<u>Area 40</u>
