




Utility Baseline and Energy Star lnerg Performance






Electric Baseline Trend






Natural Gas Baseline Trend

- > The County has 5 buildings that qualified for an award from the Energy Star Program in 2022

 - ✓ 250 William Howard Taft with a score of 79
 - Todd B. Portune Center with a score of 91
 - ✓ 800 Broadway Building with a score of 89
 - ✓ Alms & Doepke Building with a score of 99

Hamilton County Awards & Highlights



The County has received the following awards:

- Department of County Facilities received Ohio Governor's Award for Excellence in Energy Efficiency for the Five-Year Energy Conversation Program for County Facilities.
- The Buildings editorial team selected the Department of County Facilities to be included in Who's Who 2009: Leaders in Energy Management and Sustainability. They stated "This was one of a dozen organizations whose practices in energy management and sustainability have resulted in significant reductions in energy usage & operating costs."
