
# **OVER HERD**

Our main feeders and volunteers work quietly with the horses and it keeps them happy... no drama with the horses. No drama with the volunteers either. The peace at the sanctuary is so essential for the horses' well-being. Drama queens just don't work out well here.



We had some special new residents arrive last summer. Our first barn swallows moved in and hatched five babies. We are hoping they will come back next summer. It was great fun watching them clean the barn of flies.

The summer had the longest period of hot weather I had ever witnessed in my 26 years here at the sanctuary. The horses' appetites were affected and they often were not interested in eating. Some of the older ones lost some weight. Many of the horses enjoyed playing in the pond to cool off. There was no problem with them gaining back their



weight when things cooled down. Normally we would see the horses on the shady side of the covered hay feeders.

Our New Year starts with a long list of elective veterinarian care. We hope that each of you will be willing to help HPS make these possible for the horses. There will be more information coming to you soon.

Welcoming placed equines back to the sanctuary is an important service to protect the horses from slaughter in their later years. Few owners think about this issue when they are looking for a new home for the horse they may be selling or giving away. We have
