Horse With No Name

Our new investigator called and told me there was a horse in a desperate situation. These people had taken in a starved horse at the end of August. He gained some weight and he was turned out with their other horses. While turned out one of their horses kicked him so hard that it knocked him down. That horse then proceeded to try and stomp him to death. His neck swelled and quickly became infected. He has other wounds on the same side of his body from the attack. The owners talked to the vet over the phone, but they could not afford a vet visit. The owners do not live on the property or even in the county



where their horses are located. No one was there to care for the horse who could not raise his head from the ground and the infection grew worse and worse. He lost the little weight he had gained and was down to a low one on the body scoring.

It was late in the day when he was picked up and there was speculation that the horse may need to be put down. He was very weak so Tamara Eichorns agreed to take him home as her farm was much closer than the sanctuary. Dr. Robin Smith was able to see him that evening and started treatment. Tamara cared for him for almost two weeks before he gained strength and was able to make the trip to the sanctuary.

We always call a new horse "Baby" until they are strong enough to pick a name...Continued on page 2.

I think I am a glutton for punishment at times. There is so much to do at the sanctuary all the time and the hay shortage has added a good bit to the long list. HPS had planned to raise funds for the second barn this fall, but instead I had to raise funds for buying and shipping in hay. The more I thought about it the more I thought, "Why can't we both raise funds for the new barn and get funds to buy the hay? The horses desperately need that barn before the other one falls down. The twenty–six stall barn would help so much to relieve the pressure of using the old buildings." I already had all the estimates and we operate on faith here anyway. We have horses in the old triplex which was slated to be dismantled this summer, but summer was so hot that we decided to wait until fall when it would be cooler to take down the buildings. Ghost Town is still housing horses and so is every other stall that was going to be demolished.

Perry Morgan informed me he was going to expand his ponds and would give us the dirt that we needed for the second barn. The cost of the fill, transportation and compacting was going to be \$9,000. We still have to pay for the cost of moving the dirt from Perry's lower field to our site

and the compaction, but this will cut the cost greatly! After applying for grants with editing help from Deborah Baker and Roberta McCardle "The Tidings of Great Joy" is that we have secured three grants totaling \$43,500 towards construction of the second barn. It will be 72' by 72' and have 26 stalls. The style will be the same as our first barn. We should have the fill dirt in place in the next couple of weeks and our favorite barn contractor, Mannie Troyer, can start the beginning of March. If we have enough funds on hand he will be able to finish the barn very quickly. Some folks have continued to provide donations towards the second barn, which will provide another \$13,000 for a total of \$56,500. This puts us more than half way to the total that is needed. We only need approximately \$41,500 more.Continued on Page 2.

Baby is about 19 years old, but it is difficult to look at his teeth since he cannot raise his head. We have time and will figure it out later.

This brave horse came to us with so many terrible issues, and Dr. Kristi Pierce came the first day. She worked for several hours debriding the neck of the horribly emaciated boy. Half of his neck on one side is full of infection. The muscle died and had to be removed. There was concern that a foreign body or piece of broken bone may be contributing to the infection so the next morning we did digital radiographs of the neck and shoulder. We could not see anything. We are hoping the antibiotics will take care of any possible infection in the bone.

Monday Dr. Pierce returned to remove more dead tissue, fat and dead skin from his neck. He now has an on open area 8" by 9". Baby's neck has to be scrubbed once a day and then hosed off to help keep infection in check. Baby is being kept in one of the 12' by 24' hospital stalls in the new barn. He has to have a clean, dry area and yet be able to move around freely so this new stall is very important to his recovery. We are so thankful for the barn and how wonderful it has been for the horses. Thank you again to each person who has made this possible for the horses.

This is very unusual to report, but we are ending the year with a zero balance on our veterinarian bill. Thank you Holly & John Robbins and everyone else who has been so helpful during this past year. I am glad that we do not have the policy of letting horses go if the expenses are going to be high to help them recover. We believe that if a horse has been sent to us, then we need to do the responsible thing to help them recover.

HPS is so happy to welcome all the new members that are such wonderful helpers at the sanctuary. It has been such fun meeting so many wonderful folks and making new friends. Of course we could always use more help. There are always things that need to be done!

All 39 horses are doing very well. One is going to be returned that we placed. That will make 40 at the sanctuary. We placed a horse! Nancy Clark that has Quicksilver and Wind Song took Chesapeake home. Now that is a lucky horse with a great new home. We do not have any applications for horses pending. If you hear of any good folks looking for a horse please send them our way.

Some of our sickest horses are recovering slowly. Vaquero's tumors are shrinking. Oswego is recovering from a liver infection. Poor Sierra is slowly gaining weight. I still feel there is something very wrong there and I have learned that it will show up in time. Patience is one of my weaknesses. "God grant me patience... right now! Please." Our EPM horses are testing negative for active protozoa and are showing just that they have been exposed. The new Sag 1 titers test is just what has been needed.

There is so much to be thankful for and you have made it possible. Happy New Year and I pray many blessings will flow your way.
