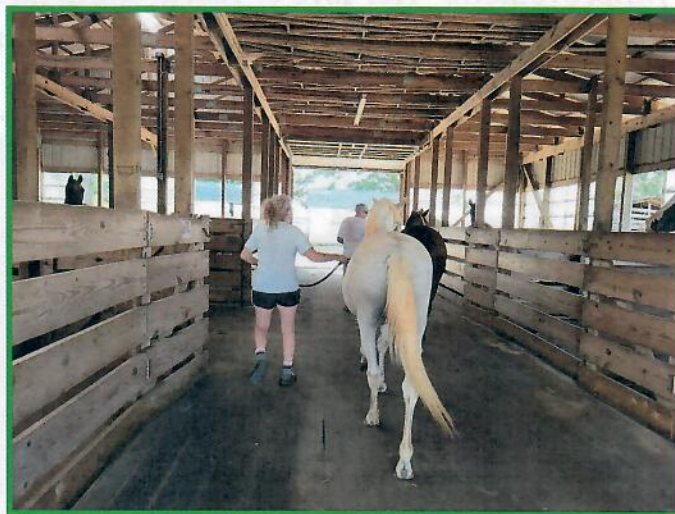
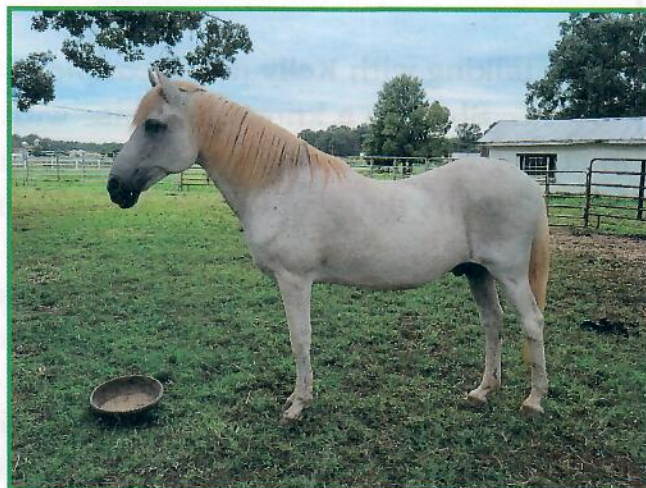


Getting to Know Burny's Story

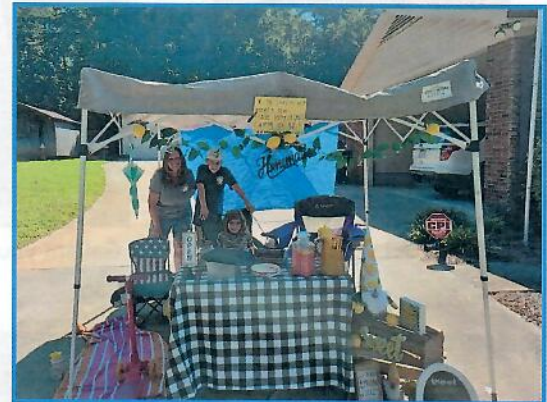
So Much More Than a Lemonade Stand
