Melanie and I scheduled a road trip to meet the dog "Pearl." Many of the Pyrs do not have the guarding instants. Pearl's write up mentioned that she had been an LGD for the first eleven months of her life, but not with horses. Shannon introduced us to Pearl in a fenced-in area.

Pearl had been placed out in different situations a number of times and been returned each time with the report of bad behavior. The Board of Directors wanted to give up on Pearl, and that meant she would be put down. The Directors are not unfeeling; they are realistic. **(Cont. on Page 2)**

Snowy is working at night and can be heard barking and running after some critters. She has a condo with a raised bed, a mattress, and blankets. We gave her a small stuffed toy and she seems to enjoy playing with it. It will take time for Snowy to develop fully into a Livestock Guard Dog.
