# SENATE BILL No. 280

#### DIGEST OF INTRODUCED BILL

**Citations Affected:** IC 7.1-2-3-7; IC 35-48-1-19.

**Synopsis:** Cannabidiol (CBD) and marijuana. Excludes certain substances with a tetrahydrocannabinol (THC) concentration of not more than 0.3% from the definition of marijuana. Authorizes the alcohol and tobacco commission to adopt rules concerning: (1) the testing of the THC concentration in certain substances; (2) the approval of a laboratory to conduct THC testing; and (3) the certification of THC test results.

Effective: July 1, 2018.

### SENATE BILL No. 280

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning criminal law and procedure.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

1	SECTION 1. IC 7.1-2-3-7 IS AMENDED TO READ AS

3	Regulations. The commission shall have the power to promulgate rules

10	governed by the provisions of this title;

12	rules and regulations of the commission;
13	(e) (5) the standards of purity and methods of manufacturing used
14	in the production of alcohol and alcoholic beverages;
15	(f) (6) the prevention of misbranding or adulteration of alcohol or
16	alcoholic beverages; and,
17	(g) (7) the prevention of fraud, evasion, trickery, or deceit in the



1	manufacture, labeling, importation, advertisement, transportation,
2	or sale of alcohol or alcoholic beverages, or the evasion of other
3	laws of Indiana relating to alcohol or alcoholic beverages; and
4	(8) the manner of:
5	(A) testing whether the tetrahydrocannabinol (THC)

13	SECTION 2. IC 35-48-1-19, AS AMENDED BY P.L.165-2014,
14	SECTION 3, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE
15	JULY 1, 2018]: Sec. 19. (a) "Marijuana" means any part of the plant
16	genus Cannabis whether growing or not; the seeds thereof; the resin
17	extracted from any part of the plant, including hashish and hash oil; any
18	compound, manufacture, salt, derivative, mixture, or preparation of the
19	plant, its seeds or resin.
20	(b) The term does not include:
21	(1) the mature stalks of the plant;
22	(2) fiber produced from the stalks;
23 24 25	(3) oil or cake made from the seeds of the plant;
24	(4) any other compound, manufacture, salt, derivative, mixture,
25	or preparation of the mature stalks (except the resin extracted
26	therefrom);
27	(5) the sterilized seed of the plant which is incapable of
28	germination; <del>or</del>
29	(6) industrial hemp (as defined by IC 15-15-13-6);
30	(7) these substances derived from the cannabis plant:
31	(A) cannabidiol;
32	(B) tetrahydrocannabivarin;
33	(C) cannabigerol;

36	(F) any other phytochemicals;
