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

Nau mai, Haere mai and Welcome to Birchville

E ngā mana, e ngā reo, e te iwi, nau mai, piki mai, whakatau mai rā.

At Birchville School we are passionate about helping children discover and achieve their potential. We recognise that people come with different values, cultures, strengths and needs and as a staff, together with our community, we are committed to celebrating diversity and providing a quality education that meets the needs of all students.

At Birchville School we see our role as helping our children shine. We do this through genuine relationships, meaningful opportunities and a rich, integrated curriculum which challenges, engages, promotes and celebrates learning for all.

Our purpose is simple:

Learn to Love, Love to Learn. Ako ki te Aroha, Aroha ki te ako.

Learning to love / Aroha ki te ako is all about building relationships. It's valuing each other in a culture of high trust, acceptance of diversity and a commitment to working together. It's also about finding the things that make us happy, that excite us, our passions and aspirations and that the more we learn the more likely we are to live full, happy lives.

Love to learn / Ako ki te Aroha is about instilling children with a passion for lifelong learning, and a positive mindset towards academic and social success. We want our learners to be aware of how they learn best, what they need to do next and demonstrate the ability to make informed choices on where, when and how they will make the required progress across the curriculum in a manner that is effective and targeted to their needs.



Starting School

It is recommended that all new students and their parents visit our school before enrolment and if you wish you may meet with Robyn Brown, our principal. This is an excellent opportunity for new families to be provided the chance to see the school and the programmes offered, for families to ask questions and to be introduced to people within our school including your child's class teacher.

Pre Enrolments

Enrolments will be accepted at any time. However, where possible, we encourage parents to pre-enrol their children up to two years prior to their fifth birthday. This assists the school in its forward planning.

Enrolment Scheme

In order to avoid overcrowding or the likelihood of overcrowding, the Birchville School Board has adopted an enrolment scheme which has been approved by the Ministry of Education.

Under this scheme, students will be enrolled if they live within the home zone. The enrolment scheme, which includes a precise description of the home zone, may be viewed on our school Website www.birchville.school.nz or at the school office, where copies of the scheme are also available.

The enrolment of out of zone students is governed by the provisions of the Education Act 1989.

If you live in the home zone and have not yet signalled your intention to enrol your child, then please contact the school immediately to assist us in our planning.

The enrolment scheme for Birchville School came into effect on Monday 3 February 2020.

Cohort Entry

Cohort entry is about helping children to settle better in school. There's evidence that starting school alongside other children helps children build relationships and supports a smoother entry to school life.

We believe it offers our tamariki the best start to their school life. It also means less disruption for our new entrant teachers who can prepare for groups of children arriving on a specific date, rather than on an individual and ad hoc basis throughout the year.

New entrants start school as a group after they have turned five, and there will be two entry points per term (beginning and mid-point).

The mid-term date is the mid-point between the start of the term and the start of the next term.

- If your child's birthday is before the start of term date, then they can start school at the beginning of that term.
- If their birthday is between the start of term date and the mid term date, then they can start school on the mid term date.
- If their birthday is between the mid term date and the start of the next term's date then they can start school at the beginning of the next term.



Birchville School Transition to School Process

At Birchville we welcome our new entrant tamariki with a gentle transition from early childhood to school by offering school visits.

An invitation will be sent out to new starters approximately 4-6 weeks before their start date. We encourage a minimum of 3 visits to foster building relationships and ensure children are settled and ready for school. These visits happen on Wednesdays in Kea Class which is located in Emerald Block.

New starters will be here for a brainfood break and morning tea, so please bring a water bottle, a piece of fruit/vegetable and a small snack to enjoy at school. (If your child is visiting in Terms One and Four a wide brimmed sun hat is required)

We request that whānau stay for the first visit in class. For visits 2 and 3 (and any further visits required) whānau have the option of staying in class, being on site or doing a drop off. Please come and see one of the kaiako to discuss this and the needs of your child.





School Information

Absences

Please contact the school by 9am when your child is absent. This can be done by ringing the school office, via our Hero app or by following the links on the school website. It is also important that the school office is informed of any changes to each families contact names, numbers and addresses. Newsletters

Parents and caregivers are kept informed of school news and activities through our School Management System (HERO). Communications can be printed in hard copy format for parents at their request, however, we are an Eco School and we are trying to reduce our paper usage.

Please be aware that between 8:30am and 3:30pm, the school car park is for staff and mobility parking permit holders only. Please refrain from parking on the yellow lines outside the schools as the road patrol children cannot see oncoming traffic.

Library

We are lucky to have a wonderful library which is run by our school librarian. Classes use the library regularly and students can have books signed out for them to enjoy at home. The library is sometimes open during lunch breaks, allowing the tamariki additional opportunities to access this fantastic facility. The Library Bus also visits our school fortnightly on a Monday afternoon.

Additional Information

Please note that Birchville is a Water Only school.

Students have a brain break where they can snack on a piece of fruit or vegetable brought in from home at approximately 10am.

We encourage minimal packaging within lunch boxes.

Wide brimmed hats MUST be worn during outside activities throughout Terms 1 & 4.

Any students riding a bike, scooter etc must wear a helmet.

If children are to walk, bike etc home from school alone or with siblings, the office must be informed.

Students cell phones may not be used at school - they must be handed in at the office at the beginning of the day, and can be collected at the end of the

Communicating & Reporting with Hero

Here at Birchville we use the communication and reporting system, Hero. An online sharing platform with complementary smart app.

Hero allows schools to customise an online environment that enables teachers, students, and families to view and share content anytime, anywhere on any device. The software is secure, easy to use and brings together all school-related information in one place.

With Hero, you have the ability to:

- read and comment on posts relating to your child's learning
- view information on your child's progress and goals,
- read and comment on school notices sent to the class or groups your child is part
 of
- respond to school notices such as surveys and trip permission requests
- view school term dates
- view a school calendar of events
- notify the school if your child is absent or late
- navigate to other school-related webpages
- customise your account by adding a profile image
- select how you wish to receive notifications

Learning posts combined with curriculum information and goal-setting will form an online report designed to build year-on-year so that over time you will have access to written posts, images, video, work samples, and helpful resources all in one place.

Over the coming year, staff and students will be posting rich content to our Hero software. We are looking forward to sharing this with you, including you in your child's learning journey.

Once enrolled please make school payments, such as stationery fees, through Hero, the School Board account: 12-3478-0038482-00 or via cash/EFTPOS in the Office. The cost for stationery for 2024 is \$40 per student.

*Each child (Yrs 1-4) will also need a named book bag, which is not covered by the stationery fee.

We also request each student to bring in a box of tissues and a tin of food for our emergency supplies.
