




Shopbuilt 1914 Model T Chemical Car. A Obenchain Boyer chemical tank was retrofitted to this 1914 Ford Model T. 16 pounds of sodium bicarbonate was added to the water in the 40 gallon tank. 8 pounds (approx. 1/2 gallon) of 98% sulfuric acid was contained in a glass jar within the tank. At the fire the glass jar was broken. Acid and the sodium bicarbonate chemically reacted forming carbon dioxide that caused enough pressure to push water out the fire hose. Chemical tanks were used from the late 1800's to the early 1930's.


