Reading Area Firefighters Museum

Walking through the Reading Area Firefighters Museum (RAFM) one discovers the rich history, artifacts, memorabilia, and firefighters that protected and served the citizens of Reading and Berks County for almost 250 years. The RAFM preserves, documents, and displays one of the richest historical firefighting collections of artifacts not only in Pennsylvania, but also in the United States. The museum's building is an important part of the Collection and the local architectural heritage. Located in the Callowhill Historic District, one of the first areas developed in the city in the 18th century, the RAFM is in the former home of Liberty Fire Company No. 5, often referred to as the "Liberties." In 1985 the building, still home to the Liberty Fire Company, was added to the National Register of Historic Places. The nomination form provides a detailed survey of the firehouse including the following quote: "one of the finest examples of Victorian architecture in the City of Reading and Berks County." The unusual combination of utilitarian purpose and architectural quality of the structure and its intact original character makes it one of the best-preserved historical landmarks in the city and county. Numerous tours have been conducted through the building and without exception of the tour participants, whatever their age, background, or experience, has been genuine surprise mixed with respect and appreciation for the elegance and beauty of the rooms.

The City of Reading, the current owners of the museum building, have recently made a commitment to invest 1.2 million dollars into the rehabilitation of the HVAC system, and other key building related components to preserve this historic structure for many generations to come. The Reading Area Firefighters Museum was established in 2004 and has successfully preserved and restored all three floors of the interior of the fire station through donations and grants. The museum houses artifacts relating to the history of firefighting from the founding of the Union Fire Company of Reading in 1770 thru modern day. We showcase the evolution of fire engines from 1770, 1812, 1909, 1924, 1931 and 1937 which all of them served here in Berks County.

Recent visitors to the museum have made the following comments on Trip Advisor: a "must see" - "tour guides were real life heroes who are passionate and knowledgeable and made me want to learn" - "incredible collection" - "blown away by the grandness of the building and the beautiful collection" - "the kids loved having their pictures taken on the fire truck" - "a hidden treasure that must be discovered".

One can see that our primary objectives at the Museum are to inform, educate and entertain. At the Reading Area Firefighters Museum, we present historical information on the evolution of firefighting with personally guided tours and "hands on" experiences. Our youth and school programs not only include student participation activities, but also a "Home Fire Safety Awareness" educational component.

In 2023 ,we will be celebrating the 250th Anniversary of the Rainbow Fire Company and the 275th anniversary of Reading, Pa.

We will be having special displays and events throughout the year.

Our operating hours are Thursdays 9am to 12 Noon and Saturday 10am to 2pm, other times available by appointment. Admission starting Jan 1, 2023, will be \$10 per adult, 16 and under are free.
