The Rotary Club of Winnipeg, founded in 1910, became the first Rotary Club to sponsor a Model United Nations Assembly (MUNA) in 1957. It has organized MUNA annually ever since. Each year, up to 150 high school students from western Canada, and the northern U.S. gather in Winnipeg to debate and build consensus on pressing global issues through this two-day immersive simulation of the UN General Assembly and its substantive Committees. Like the UN, MUNA focuses on accomplishing collective goals through mutual understanding and creates an opportunity for generating a culture of consensus-building among future leaders. MUNA takes pride in its long legacy of leadership skills development; among our alumni are a Premier, a Federal Foreign Affairs Minister and Nobel Prize nominee, a Foreign Diplomat, a Grand Chief, and other public servants.
