In the month of November I joined a group of friends on a Step A Way to the New Melleray Abbey near Dubuque. It was a well-organized three days and two nights of silence and contemplative practices amid the monks, stone walls and fir trees. We were led by Becky Elsbernd and Rev. Stephen Benitz.

During our time at the Abbey, we read and re-read the story of the loaves and the fishes from Mark 6. We paused to pray with the monks at 4:30 / Vigils, 7:30 / Lauds, 11:45 / (Sext), 1:45 / None, 5:30 / Vespers and 7:30 / Compline. We practiced Centering Prayer, a Daily Examen, Lectio Divina, Prayer of Imagination and considered a Rule of Life (developed by Benedict of Nursia). At times we ate in silence. At times we had a choice to spend time alone or to enter shared space with supplies provided for art and crafts.

I embraced the experience from the moment I committed to the time away. I made a practice of getting up earlier (so . . . going to bed earlier) and found peace in the pre-dawn hours. I recognized my current contemplative practices as yoga, meditation, walks (with Lucky-dog) and energetic prayer, but began to see even my “work” as prayer. And, at a mention from Becky, I picked up my knitting (after many years) to bring along. I made time before and since to join our knitting group at St. John’s. Lovely!

As I returned home I have leaned into “slow down”, “let go” and “keep it simple”. These intentions create space for living fully each day. And in preparation for the blessed seasons of Advent and Christmas, I encourage you to nurture your own rhythms of silence.

Reminders from St. John's Vestry

The procedure for hospitalized members is to call the church office or Sue Stone at 641-231-4202. A family member or a Mercy/Hospice Chaplain can do this for you. The procedure to be used in the case that someone is deceased, is to call the church office or Sue. Sue will proceed as needed.

Using the Church Building Reminders

Please remember to clean up after your group event.

If you use the dishwasher, remember to finish and remove the loads of dishes and drain the dishwasher before shutting it off. Instructions are on the wall by the dishwasher sink. Put away all clean dishes.

Wipe off tables, kitchen counters, and put the room like it was when you came. DO NOT touch the thermostat. The temperature is set for the entire building. Take out the trash (trash dumpster in next to St. John's in the alley).

Turn off lights and make sure the room door is left open. When you exit the building be sure the exit door locks behind you and that any other entrances are locked.

If you are unable to do these tasks, please contact the church office before your gathering.

ALL building use needs to be arranged with the church office.


It is Vestry Nomination Time
