When you look at this case, the first question is simple: **Why would this woman lie?** She reported being held at gunpoint, unlawfully restrained, and threatened by people she believed were impersonating officers. These are not minor accusations — they are felonies.

But here's the part everyone needs to pay attention to:

Mint Hill Police DID believe her.

They took her statement seriously enough to complete a full case report and refer the matter to the Mecklenburg County District Attorney. Law enforcement agencies do not forward cases to the DA unless they believe a crime may have occurred.

So, if Mint Hill PD treated this as a legitimate criminal investigation, the real question becomes:

Why did the Matthews Police Department stay silent — and why was no action taken against the officer involved?

Instead of transparency, the public got nothing.

Instead of accountability, the officer was **kept on the force and later promoted to sergeant.**

That is not how a department behaves when it is confident in its own integrity.

This isn't about politics. It's about public trust, public safety, and the basic expectation that law enforcement agencies will be honest with the communities they serve.

The public deserves answers — not silence, not omissions, and certainly not promotions for officers tied to serious allegations.
