I. Upcoming Exhibits Information

A) Future AAEGV Library Exhibits - Monthly Themes

These exhibit themes for members can be interpreted in any manner you wish. If you have work you would like to exhibit and it does not quite fit the theme, that's okay, bring it in! Due to increased membership, bring up to two (2) pictures.

1) August – Drawing Pen & Ink (Drop-Off & Peach Pantone Pick-Up: Saturday 8/03 @ 9:15-10 am at the Elk Grove Public Library)

2) September - Bikes, Trikes, and More (Drop-Off & Drawing Pen & Ink Pick-Up: Saturday 8/31 @ 9:15-10 am at the Elk Grove Public Library)

3) October - Annual Juried Art Show (New for 2024 Show: only 2 entries per artist).

4) November – "Storytime" Let your art tell a story (either about the artwork or the artist) and include a typed story to be hung with your art.

B) AAEGV-- 41st Annual Juried Art Show Information

A brochure has been attached to this newsletter with information about this fall season's *41*st *Annual Juried Art Show*. The show will open on Friday, October 18th from 6:00 – 8:00 pm at the Elk Grove Public Library with the kick-off reception. Drop-off is scheduled for Thursday, October 17th and pick-up for entries by artists that are not awarded ribbons will be Sunday, October 20th. JAS Entries are due by Saturday, September 7th (3:00 pm) at the Elk Grove Park District. An artist may submit up to 2 entries (watercolor, oil, pastels, pencil/pen, mixed-media, sculpture) no larger than 30" any side of the piece. The entry fee is \$30 for AAEGV members, \$60 for non-members.

Our judge for the JAS will be the exceptional artist, **Brian Sauerland**. All work must be original, completed within the last two years, and the piece must not have been awarded prizes in previous AAEGV or other Juried Exhibits. Full information and rules are available in the entry brochure that will accompany this and the August-September newsletters.

C) Elk Grove Historical Society Info

The Elk Grove Historical Museum put together a short video about the elements of art and used some of the artwork that is hanging in the museum from the current *"Reimaginings*" exhibit in which many AAEGV artists have participated.
