A) Future AAEGV Library Exhibits - Monthly Themes

These exhibit themes for members can be interpreted in any manner you wish. If you have work you would like to exhibit and it does not quite fit the theme, that's okay, bring it in! Due to increased membership, bring up to two (2) pictures.

- 1) October (Pick-Up for Bikes, Trikes, & More on Saturday, October 5th @ 9:15-10 am at the Elk Grove Public Library)
- 2) *Annual Juried Art Show* -- Friday October 18th 6:00 7:00 pm, Saturday, 10/19: 9:00 am 5:00 pm, & Sunday 10/20 9:00-3:00 pm. The *Winner's Showcase* will be exhibited for the remainder of the month. If one piece of art is awarded a ribbon and you have 2 pieces in the show, they both remain up for the month.
- 3) November "Storytime" Drop-off Saturday, November 2^{nd} . Let your art tell a story (either about the artwork or the artist) and include a typed story to be hung with your art. Write a blurb about the art, the artist, the meaning, etc. Make it no longer than $1 8 \frac{1}{2}$ " x11" page will be hung next to the art. These will remain on exhibit through the end of 2024.

Drop-off is scheduled for Thursday, October 17^{th} from 10 am-Noon and again from 6:00-7:00 pm (EG Public Library). The show will open on Friday, October 18^{th} from 6:00-8:00 pm at the Elk Grove Public Library with the kick-off reception. Pick-up for entries by

artists that are not awarded ribbons will be Sunday, October 20th from 3:00-4:00 pm. *JAS Entries are due by Saturday, September 7th (3:00 pm) at the Elk Grove Park District*. An artist may submit up to 2 entries (watercolor, oil, pastels, pencil/pen, mixed-media, sculpture) no larger than 30" on any side of the piece. The entry fee is \$30 for AAEGV members, \$60 for non-members. Don't forget to email aaegvexhibits@gmail.com your painting information and pictures of your work.

Our judge for the JAS will be the exceptional artist, **Brian Sauerland**. All work must be original, completed within the last two years, and the piece must not have been awarded prizes in previous AAEGV or other Juried Exhibits.
