

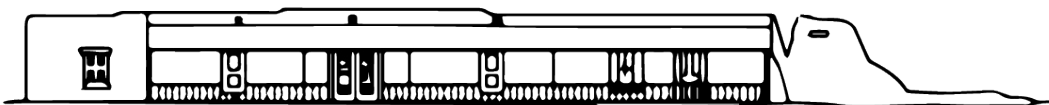


# Gutiérrez-Hubbell House

## Museum Docent/Educator

**Supervised by:** Gutiérrez-Hubbell House Staff

**Locations:** Gutiérrez-Hubbell House History and Cultural Center

**General Description:** Volunteer docents lead visitors on tours of the house and may assist the public by answering questions or providing general information about the property. Docents may also assist with school field trips depending on availability. Shifts are Friday-Saturday for either 10:00am-12:00pm or 1:00pm-3:00pm.

**Time Commitment:** Volunteer activities to be accomplished over a minimum period of 2 hours and maximum of 8 hours on any given day, not to exceed 40 hours in a week, depending on the volunteer position.

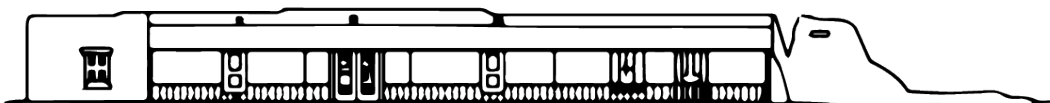
**Health & Physical Requirement:** Ability to lift 10 lbs and work on uneven terrain, varies by program and volunteer role. Minimum age requirement is 18.

**Qualifications:** No special skills or training needed. We provide all training, tools, and leadership.

## Garden Caretaker/Educator

**Supervised by:** Gutiérrez-Hubbell House Staff

**Locations:** Gutiérrez-Hubbell House History and Cultural Center

**General Description:** Volunteers will assist with care of the interpretive gardens including weeding, mulching trails, planting, and pruning when needed. Volunteers may also occasionally help with educational programs depending on availability and skill set.

**Time Commitment:** Volunteer activities to be accomplished over a minimum period of 2 hours and maximum of 8 hours on any given day, not to exceed 40 hours in a week, depending on the volunteer position.

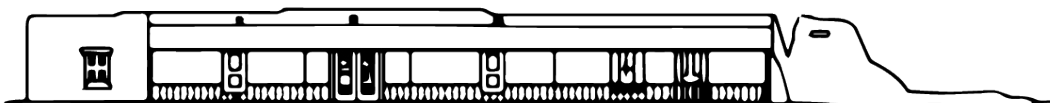
**Health & Physical Requirement:** Ability to lift 20 lbs and work on uneven terrain, varies by program and volunteer role. Minimum age requirement is 18 unless accompanied by an adult.

**Qualifications:** Skill in identifying plants and knowledge of plant care as well as proper gardening techniques for the region. Tools and specialized site training will be provided.

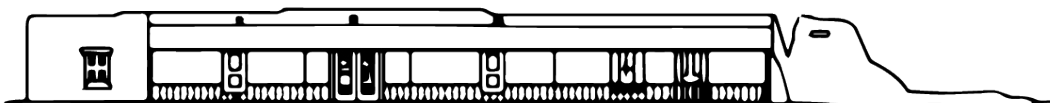
