From yesterday's sermon: "New pathways"

".....The covenant, the new covenant that God, the God who is in the midst, has and continues to make with all people is a covenant that frees all to hear, see, taste, touch, and experience most fully and most closely the love and goodness of God. God's covenant secures a changed future, a new sense of being. God's covenant brings about a whole new reality into which all of us are invited to step. Brought close to God, the God of love and grace, changes us, must change us, changing us towards the image and likeness of God, changing us towards love, peace, justice, mercy, away from vindictiveness, away from anger, away from pride and greed, ever towards God.

As we have progressed through this Lenten season we have already responded to some of the many stories in the Old Testament about covenant, from Noah and the rainbow, through Abraham and Sarah and their many descendants (including us), to Moses and the people at the foot of Mt. Sinai. In this week's reading from Jeremiah, we hear God promise through the prophet, a covenant not of stone and not external, a covenant written deep inside, on the very hearts of the people.

In the context of the ministry of Jeremiah this Covenant speaks of rescue and release... restoration and return... to captives. We must remember that this promise from God to the people of Israel comes while they are in captivity, still in exile, still stuck in Babylon, far from home, steeped in their overwhelming sense of loss and grief that had broken their hearts and their spirits. Their nation has been overrun, their capital city has been destroyed and their conqueror Babylon has carried away their leaders to the far-off capital of its powerful empire.

All of this defeat, despair, exile had been predicted by a younger Jeremiah who had scolded his own people asking them, begging them, to be faithful to God. Now, this self-same prophet, Jeremiah speaks a different word from God to the people. To a defeated people the prophet shares good news, to a troubled people the prophet proclaims comfort and hope. This is the message that Jeremiah the prophet speaks but of course it is not his message but God's message... it is God who has compassion for the people; it is God's heart that has been touched by their suffering, and God has resolved to forgive them and start all over again. All over again, God will start all over again!

Once again, in this time of brokenness and exile and seeming hopelessness God, as in all the covenant stories previously, promises to be in relationship with the people -- like the promises God made to Noah and to Abraham and Sarah, and to Moses and the people at Sinai, God now promises to be with and abide with the people. God says, I will be your God, and you...you will be my people....."

One Great Hour of Sharing at Faith on Easter Sunday

One Great Hour of Sharing makes a difference in the world.

Presbyterian Disaster Assistance (PDA) works alongside communities as they recover and find hope after the devastation of natural or human-caused disasters, and support for refugees. It receives 32% of the funds raised.

Presbyterian Hunger Program (PHP) acts to alleviate hunger, care for creation, and the systemic causes of poverty so all may be fed. It received 36% of the funds raise. **Self-Development of People (SDOP)** invest in communities responding to their experiences of oppression, poverty and injustice and educates Presbyterians about the impact of these issues. It receives 32% of the funds raised.

National aid: 25 states received help following natural and human-caused disasters, including flooding in North and South Carolina, Texas, Missouri, Kansas, Indiana, Michigan and New York; wildfires in California, Tennessee, Texas and Kansas, ongoing response to hurricanes and various public violence incidents.

International aid: In the first half of 2017, 11 countries received aid and support after catastrophic events, including the violence and famine in South Sudan, flooding in Peru and Colombia, cholera prevention and food security in Haiti, drought in Malawi and Kenya, and ongoing assistance for refugees and internally displaced person related to Syria.

New Building Update



Exciting news! More updates and pictures to follow.

Here is the first step in supplying water to the Faith property on Bluebird Road. Last Thursday the county contractor installed a large water tap into the McCaysville water line. The next step is to bore under the driveway for the Valero station on the corner of Hwy. 60 and Hwy. 515.

The New Building Committee has released the new church project at Blue Bird Road to our Contractor, RCCI, to develop the drawings for pricing and

construction. This phase can take a few months as there is much to be engineered and designed at this time. It's an exciting milestone to reach and we are eager to review these drawings and soon thereafter entertain pricing for the project. Please continue to pray for God's direction, guidance and wisdom as our Committee and Contractor work through the details.
