Sermon: "The Good Life"

#### From yesterday's sermon: "Body and Soul"

".... From watching TV most of us are likely familiar with some of the campaigns sponsored by the Ad Council, "A mind is too good a thing to waste" or "Friends don't let friends drive drunk." The Ad Council usually springs into action only after being approached by a charity or good cause seeking to get their message out but back in 2006 the Ad Council launched its very first campaign that originated from within itself. This Campaign was called "Generous Nation," and was epitomized by the tagline, "Don't almost give. Give." The goal of the campaign was to tap into the growing interest in volunteer work, among baby-boomers and to tap into generosity even when there were no national or international tragedies on the front pages of the newspapers.

One ad for this Campaign showed a man with crutches struggling to go up a flight of steps. The narrator says, "This man almost learned to walk at a rehab center that almost got built by people

who almost gave money." After a pause the narrator continues, "Almost gave. How good is almost giving? About as good as almost walking."

Another ad shows a homeless man curled up in a ball atop a pile of rags. He is covered with a ratty bed sheet. The narrator begins, "This is Jack Thomas. Today someone almost bought Jack something to eat. Someone almost brought him to a shelter. Someone almost gave him a warm blanket." Then after a pause the narrator drives his point home, "And Jack Thomas? Well, he almost made it through the night."

#### Sound familiar?

14 What good is it, my brothers and sisters, if you say you have faith but do not have works? Can faith save you? 15 If a brother or sister is naked and lacks daily food, 16 and one of you says to them, "Go in peace; keep warm and eat your fill," and yet you do not supply their bodily needs, what is the good of that? 17 So faith by itself, if it has no works, is dead.

It is our calling to be with and for one another and all our neighbors, Body and Soul... this is the way of Jesus Christ – it is what we always aim to be though sometimes we fail; it is why we worship and pray and serve; it is why we tend our church garden, walk in parades, volunteer at the Labor Day BBQ, give blood, contribute, work and care; it is why we are planning a church building to serve not as an escape for the community and world but as our future base of operations – believing and doing; caring and loving; serving and sharing.... Body and Soul – inspired by the example of Jesus and as Jesus leads and guides. Body and Soul. Amen."
