## From Pastor Jim Simpson's January 6 sermon: "Outsiders no more"

"This morning I want us to reflect on the significance of the visit not of the wise guys but of the wise men, the visitors from afar, who came seeking a King, who visited the manger and worshipped the Christ child. This morning, right here and now, in my words and in our shared imagination let us allow each of these visitors tell their own story to us that we might best see and know our Savior...."

**Now, the fourth speaks**, for yes, nowhere in scripture does it specify that there were three visitors searching and seeking, only that three gifts were offered:

This fourth speaks with a strange accent different from the travelers from the East. It is said he's from the West, from a small, cold, windy, beautiful green mountainous island up North, so far up north, that it is lapped by the North Sea and the Atlantic Ocean.

This one speaks of all the gifts brought and offered by the other visitors with whom he made common cause to seek out the new King. He makes common cause with others, very different from himself because to truly recognize Jesus the King it always requires us to make common cause.

This one seeks to speak of all the implications of the coming of this Child in the manger. He speaks out of his own wonder at the coming of the Savior, he speaks to persuade others, to counsel, to encourage.

This one speaks out of and on behalf of a faith community that is itself on the move, a fellowship that has always been open to hearing and acting upon the call of God, a community willing to uproot itself in order to travel to that place where it has seen and recognized the call and invitation of God so that yet more people may be touched by and discover and experience for themselves, the tender, forgiving, emboldening love of the Child of Bethlehem.

This community's gold is a representation of years of education and work and labor of bodies and minds and peoples' sensible approach to saving and retirement this gold is now offered freely and gladly and generously that more and more of the travelers we encounter and the people we meet on our life's journey might come to accept God's invitation to come and meet and worship the Savior of us all.

Gold for God, gold not for hoarding but for giving and sharing, gold investing in the good and godly purposes of seeking, caring, sharing and serving.

Gold representing our very best intentions, our most tender attitudes and actions, our most compassionate caring and passionate service of others, our love and devotion for the Christ whose birth we are celebrating, whose life we revere, whose death and resurrection forever gives us hope.

Our community also gifts its frankincense – our best intentions and dearest desires that elevate our seeing, that lift our gaze, that extend our vision, that raise our sense of all that is at stake as we build and prepare a new building in which Christ can be birthed and lived and shared and worshiped. This building – a manger of sorts always with room for our Savior a means to the end and purpose of coming near and alongside people who like us need to know there is hope. So that we can be present for those who with us want to experience a new life of restoration and renewal, that flows from the heart and essence of God. Space to meet and share the God who has come close, who has drawn near and draws us ever nearer still – to love, to joy, to peace, to hope, to our neighbors, to our friends and yes even to those we had previously thought of as enemies, because confronted with the very essence of love and holy purpose we kneel in adoration and wonder and prayer ... all of us... all....

And we also share our myrrh, myrrh to mark our dying to our old selves, our old lives, that we might embrace the new life that God has for us in our Savior. Myrrh that connect us to our own pains and struggles and losses, making us ever more aware of the needs and challenges of the people around us.

Laying aside all prejudice and hatred; leaving behind all ingratitude and selfishness, and turning aside from suspicion and intolerance, we become yet more aware of the love within which we and all people and all life is held and in the strength of that love we love, we love as God loves, we love all whom God loves, we love all that God loves. It is in such a love that we anticipate every aspect of our developing life as a church family from Mountain Street to Bluebird Road and in all that this journey will ask of us and bring to us.

The arrival of the Magi before the holy family is not the final scene around the manger. The gifts there offered do not declare the end of Christmas instead they point the way forward into the impact that Jesus will always have upon human society and the call that Jesus has upon our loyalties. The arrival of the Magi confirm that the Kingdom of God has and is coming near, even before John or Jesus Himself would be able to proclaim the Kingdom. In contrast to the Magi who bent their knee and offered their gifts, Herod, the tyrant, did as tyrants always do, he chose terror and violence.

T.S. Eliot ended his poem, “Journey Of The Magi”, imagining the thoughts of the magi:

*“All this was a long time ago, I remember,  
And I would do it again, but set down  
This set down  
This: were we led all that way for Birth or Death?  
There was a Birth, certainly,  
We had evidence and no doubt. I had seen birth and death,  
But had thought they were different;  
this Birth was Hard and bitter agony for us, like  
Death, our death.*

Jesus does not make my life more comfortable;  
Jesus doesn't help me fit in and succeed within a world at odds with the will of God;  
Jesus challenges and chides and nudges and urges me towards goodness, and grace and faith and service.  
We can no longer be at ease in a world not committed to Jesus.

A strange, unfamiliar road is now our path. But this road is going somewhere, going somewhere hopeful and truthful and special because it is a road to the Christ and with the Christ and for the Christ of God.

On this road we would continue offering our gifts and our hope knowing that in the gift of God in Christ, our generosity to each other and to all will increase... for thanks to our Savior Jesus we and all people are outsiders no more. Amen...."

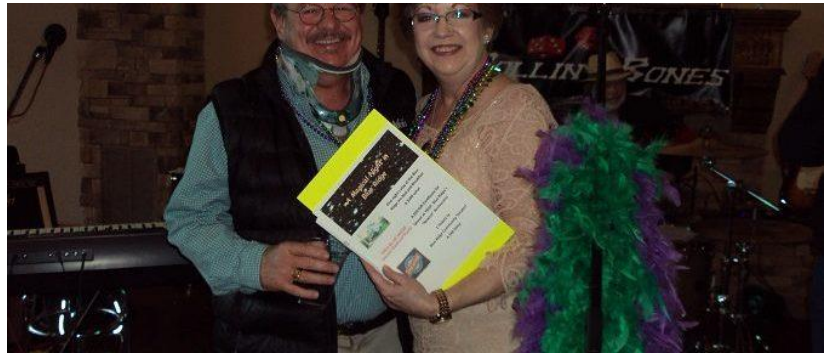


### Mission and Outreach

**Snack in a Backpack** is a 501(c)3 non-profit that helps feed the Youth of Fannin County on the weekends. We pack over 400 bags each week and they are delivered to the 5 Fannin County Schools and Head Start Preschool. This year we were excited to

be able to be a part of the Summer meal program helping serve over 12,000 meals during the summer to over 300 children. This expanded the Snack program to a year-round program. During the 2017-2018 school year we packed approximately 10,000 bags totaling about 55,000 meals. Since school started for the 2018-2019 school year, we have packed 6000 bags and 27,000 meals.

We are in the process of planning our 8<sup>th</sup> Annual Fundraiser – “*Bringin’ the Blues to Blue Ridge*” that takes place on Saturday, February 23<sup>rd</sup> at Mercier Orchards. Tickets are on
