

From Pastor Jim Simpson's December 8 sermon: "Turn!"

"...Turn! is the message of John the Baptist as we hear it again today in Matthew 3. While the culture around us hurtles to or is already engaged in so many celebrations of the birth of Jesus, here we are in church, pausing for longer, seeking to hear all that God's coming with us and for us and among us means by entering the wilderness to hear the message of this wild-eyed, somewhat eccentric preacher with some strange dietary habits, as John looks us all in the eye and says, Repent! Turn! Turn to God's way, turn to God's plan for living and going. Turn from the way you are headed and go in a new direction. The word for repentance in Hebrew can be translated as just this, to turn. In Greek the metanoia – means to take on a new mindset, to think and act differently, to turn from one course of action or direction, to go in a different way. Thus John's message "Repent" can be delivered, "Turn!"....

The turning we need to make is aligning our living in accordance with the life of our Savior and Lord.....

We need this message, the message of John: TURN! in our lives and our church this Advent. We need to know that we are always being asked to Turn. To TURN to God, to turn away from any other path, to keep on turning in devotion and dedication. God wants us all to TURN not because God wants to heap upon you all the guilt that the church has so often done. The church has used guilt as its currency, which the church has traded in especially towards certain people and certain aspects of human behavior for way too long!

Within this fellowship today, as in other churches like Faith, we have the joy and privilege of welcoming some who are recovering from some misstatement of or some mistaken application of the faith of Jesus Christ. We have people recovering from Christian judgment. People who were raised to know only their guilt in each and every moment of their daily or weekly lives and despite their best efforts and despite their practice of their faith in the Church tradition in which they were raised, ended up sensing only judgment not grace; condemnation, not forgiveness. We have people were victims of those who had the audacity to stand behind some pulpit somewhere, imposing their own singular, "narrow" interpretation of Scripture, as the only sure and certain truth about God which had to be accepted, take it or leave it, rather than it being open to genuine intellectual, emotional and reasonable questions. We have people who are here because of who they are in themselves or who their family members are, as the people God made them to be, who knew the keen and hurtful edge of human banishment in the name of the God they knew and loved.

We have people within our congregation and present today who have experienced all these rejections from the church, and others excluded in other ways. They are present here in part because they have heard us say, and they have seen us seek to practice, "AT Faith, ALL are welcome." Let this word go out, that "At Faith all are always welcome" not because we are super good or real kind people; not because we are in any way better people than others but because of who we are discovering God to be in Jesus Christ.

Knowing Jesus, seeking and following Jesus implores us to state and live that here at Faith All are FULLY welcome, because we have discovered that in our TURN to God, there is never less room for others to make the same TURN, but more room. In our TURN to God there is a place for each and all. In our TURN to God, God has care for us all, and for any and each.

By now I trust and hope that all of you realize just how crucially and vitally important our experience of God's grace and welcome is in who we are as a church and all we seek to be and do in the community and surrounding world. I also trust and hope that all of you realize exactly how much our expression of that grace and welcome matters... because that grace and welcome is needed in the lives of people, people we know, and people we will come to know. The late William Muehl, long time Divinity Professor and author relates this gentle story, a reminder of what matters:

"One December afternoon ... a group of parents stood in the lobby of a nursery school waiting to claim their children after the last pre-Christmas class... As the youngsters ran from their lockers, each one carried in his hands the "surprise," the brightly wrapped package on which they had been working diligently for weeks. One small boy, trying to run, put on his coat, and wave to his parents, all at the same time, slipped and fell. His "surprise" flew from his grasp, landed on the floor and broke with an obvious ceramic crash.

The child ... began to cry inconsolably. His father, trying to minimize the incident and comfort the boy, patted his head and murmured, "Now, that's all right son. It doesn't matter. It really doesn't matter at all." But the child's mother, somewhat wiser in such situations, swept the boy into her arms and said, "Oh, but it does matter. It matters a great deal." And she wept with her son."

What we do here matters! Who we are matters! The experience of God's grace for all matters a great deal! It matters to God, it matters to all who come together and have a place and a church family here within which all are safe, accepted, welcomed and encouraged in our life and faith and service to others, all of us together, offering and extending God's welcome as the people we are!

Who we are matters! What we do in Advent matters! Our Advent worship, our Advent expectations, our Advent hymns matter! This ADVENT we are singing, "The World is about to turn"! John the Baptizer has one foot in the old age that is coming to a close and the other foot in the new age that is being born and comes inviting us once again to Turn! Turn to God! Turn to God's grace! Turn to God's people! Turn! Turn and see that there is room for you and a place

for all! Turn and invite and seek to draw others in. John the Baptizer makes it so clear. His message comes to us from the wilderness to all. We would listen, it does matter. We do matter. What we do matters! Turn! Amen."



For those of us gathered together in Advent expectation, we know that the only perfect gift ever given was the one we received in Jesus Christ -- a perfect gift from a gracious God.

In Matthew's Gospel, one of the names given to Jesus is Emmanuel, which means "God is with us." We know that in Jesus, we receive the perfect gift of God being with us. What a powerful gift, a perfect gift, the gift of ... being with. Although we cannot give the perfect gift, we can give generously to support and be with our past, present and future leaders in their time of promise and their time of need.
