

Sermon Title: "Mercy!"

From Pastor Jim Simpson's October 13 sermon: "Rise!"

"...As we have seen in our readings from The Gospel of Luke, one of the themes upon which the writer of the Gospel lays a great emphasis is Jesus' practice of crossing boundaries and barriers to engage with those deemed as "outsiders". Both in Luke and in the same writer's second volume, The Acts of the Apostles we continually see and hear first Jesus, and then the

Church of Jesus cross barriers and step over and past boundaries to connect with and bring in these outsiders – women, the ritually unclean, children, Gentiles, Roman soldiers, Eunuchs, and lepers and even Samaritan lepers.

The presence of this specific encounter in the Gospel of Luke confirms the writer's intentions because remember that the Gospel of Luke is the only New Testament Gospel that contains the Parable of the Good Samaritan. The writer of this Gospel and Acts has a deep passion to persuade their readers, including you and I, that Jesus moves past, over, around human barriers to engage all with the love and grace and goodness of the God, who loves the world and who loves without limit. Indeed it might be better to say that Jesus abolishes such barriers and boundaries, refusing always to be limited in to whom and for whom Jesus will act in love. It is inescapably therefore our calling to do the same, as we follow our Savior, as we trust our Lord. Going "Beyond the wood and stone" towards, to and for all people and into every and any situation.

From what we read in the opening verse of today's reading we see that Jesus deliberately enters the borderlands, the area that is an in-between place between Galilee and Samaria. There were other ways, other routes, by which Jesus could have continued His journey from Galilee to Jerusalem, without going into these borderlands. Jesus could have continued towards Jerusalem avoiding Samaria and the Samaritans altogether, but that was not the way Jesus chose to travel. And so it was that Jesus arrives at the edge of a village and is greeted by a group of lepers, ten in number who wish Jesus to intervene in their situation and offer them help and hope.

The manner of their engagement with Jesus is very proper given their awareness of their condition. Conscious, very conscious of their need to not get close to anyone else because of their condition they approach Jesus, they intersect Jesus, but yet keep their distance. They call out to Jesus, they don't whisper, they don't merely speak, they call out to Jesus because they are not up close and personal but stand a short distance away from Jesus. Their mode and manner of addressing Jesus indicates that they have a sense, a belief, that Jesus is someone who can indeed help them and can and might and hopefully will choose and wish to intervene on their behalf, "Jesus! Master! Have mercy on us!" In engaging with Jesus as they do, in pleading for Jesus' assistance, these lepers, these people, place their need, their pain, their distress, their isolation, their lives, their hopes, their future into Jesus' hands.

In passing isn't this faith... isn't this what we are all called to do, isn't this our invitation and also our challenge? To place our lives, our needs and hopes, all that we are into the hands of Jesus and in so doing to seek to be in ourselves, focused on the right things, willing to forgive, ready to be reconciled, prepared to serve and care and help and encourage? Sometimes we find it easier to live in this faith-filled manner when our backs are against some wall, but we are in fact invited and asked to live in this faithful manner even when things are really good for us.

Without discussion, without delay, without question, without debate, without asking anything more, without touching them, Jesus tells them to go and show themselves to the priests and as they do this, we are told, off-stage, if you like, that they are made clean.

It is here that we have sometimes read into the story and we probably ought not. For we then hear that the one of the ten returned to thank Jesus and he was a Samaritan. I think we have imagined that the text was hereby saying that the others were Jews and yet only the one, and a Samaritan, to boot, came back to thank Jesus but that is not present in what we read... all we know is that the one who came back to express gratitude, to thank Jesus and praise God was indeed a Samaritan.

Nowhere does it say that some, any, nine of the lepers were Jews and one a Samaritan, it may well be that they were all Samaritans. What matters here is the nature and depth of the response on the one – their response is faith and gratitude, trusting and thanking!

The healing itself as we noted happened off-stage. The expression of thanks, was stage front and center, with the spotlights turned on full blast, narrowed and focused. In terms of last week's reading regarding faith, all ten lepers, all ten of them had faith enough – all ten of them had that mustard seed of faith – to hear and act upon what Jesus said to them – they all had faith enough to go to the priests – maybe even Samaritan priests – and they were healed. Once again we are seeing the passion and ministry of Jesus, that is forever bringing people from the margins into the center continues and thrives and offers hope and healing to and for all people.

Jesus' final words with the returnee certainly suggest and imply in that person some sense of a yet deeper healing and renewed purpose than merely the removal of their skin condition.

In the first place we should note that there are only three miracle/ healing incidents in the Gospel of Luke unrelated to conversations/ arguments between Jesus and His opponents – the healing of the hemorrhaging woman, the blind man in Jericho and this one, with the grateful leper. In all three of these situations Jesus says, "your faith has made you well", a different phrasing from all other healings indicating that the depth of healing goes beyond the mere physical healing to a restored relationship with God.

Secondly, we should be aware that when Jesus says to the man "get up" or "rise up" the word in the original Greek translated as "get up" is the word for resurrection! In effect Jesus is saying to him, "Rise up, rise up to new life, rise into Resurrection life, rise into the fullness of God's life, life beyond even death." Jesus sees and promises that this person is experiencing the very fullness of God's love even as his own "faith" is expressed in profound gratitude towards Jesus - this person's life is changing inside and out!

The depth of the man's gratitude is seen in the words in which he expresses his gratitude to Jesus. We read that the man praised God. In the Greek doxazo, the word that gives us doxology – the essence and distillation of praise! And the man thanks Jesus, the Greek word eucharisto,

the word that comes into English as eucharist, the feast of Thanksgiving, used in several Christian traditions as the name for the celebration of communion. No wonder the Reformer, Martin Luther, once defined the worship of the Church, the Christian community as, "the tenth leper turning back [to Jesus]!"....."
