History is filled with the biography of great leaders, whether politicians, economists, or religious ones, to name but a few, in which we can find some common qualities, pushing them toward success and also distinguishing them from ordinary people. From among the world leaders, in my opinion, Mahatma Gandhi is the one who has enormously contributed to and been the source of inspiration for the people of the world in general and Indian people in particular. The reasons why I believe so are manifold—three of which, however, are of great consequence: his leadership skills, personality, and demeanor.

The first and <u>foremost</u> quality of a successful leader is <u>enjoying</u> the major <u>attributes</u> of leadership, which he was perfectly <u>blessed with</u>. Leadership by <u>consent</u> of and with the <u>sympathy</u> of the followers, <u>rather than</u> leadership by force, is the <u>cornerstone</u> of dynamic leadership. Without the <u>orthodox</u> tools of power, <u>namely</u> authority, military strength, or wealth, Gandhi succeeded in unifying the whole nation to attain the independence of India from foreign domination. Gandhi's unifying personality helped him to <u>practice</u> non-violent civil disobedience and <u>inspired</u> others to do the same. His being trustworthy, ethical, self-sacrificing, and <u>worldly-wise</u> encouraged the people of India to have absolute trust in him, enabling him to accomplish the astounding <u>feat</u> of influencing two hundred million minds to <u>coalesce</u> and move in unison, as a single mind, which is impossible to achieve through force.

Another reason that makes Gandhi so worthy of admiration <u>has to do with</u> his personal qualities. Gandhi possessed <u>magnetism</u> of personality, persistence, <u>willpower</u>, faith, and courage—all of which are the characteristics a great man can <u>enjoy</u>. 4.7 Tips to Have in Mind While Writing

4.7.1 Diction: Choose the right words.

Students learning to use a thesaurus often use it excessively and incorrectly in their selection of words. Knowing that all synonyms do not mean the same thing—that each synonym has a subtle nuance of meaning making it distinct from the other words—will help you avoid random substitutions of words that merely seem to look better. Using good diction in your essay involves choosing exactly the right word for the meaning you want. If you are unsure of a word's meaning, look it up in a learner's dictionary.

Poor Diction: Devlin's essay <u>predicates</u> that a society consists of a group of people brought together by a common set of morals and <u>assurances</u>.

Better Diction: Devlin's essay <u>asserts</u> that a society consists of a group of people brought together by a common set of morals and <u>beliefs</u>.

Poor Diction: Hart responds that Devlin's essay is nothing more than a <u>babble</u> and <u>malentendu</u> of what a society is.

Better Diction: Hart responds that Devlin's essay is nothing more than a <u>confusion</u> and <u>misunderstanding</u> of what a society is.

4.7.2 Vary your sentence length.

"Choppiness" is the effect of multiple short sentences in a row giving a sense of breathlessness and childlike simplicity. Contrastingly, the opposite - multiple, successive elongated sentences one after another - gives a sense of never-ending lung-power and pompous sophistication. A short sentence can be a good option for the content you are writing, just as a long one can as well. The key is to mix them up so that you have some short sentences and some long alternating with each other. This variety will give rhythm to your prose.

Choppy sentences: John turned on the computer. He opened Frame maker. He selected a new document. The document was blank. He opened the graphics panel. He chose the shape tool. It was a polygon. He filled the polygon with red shading. He put a black border on it. It was a nice day. His mother brought him sandwiches. The sandwiches tasted good. (Holy Smoke! I could not take more than about half a page of this before I would go crazy!)

Over-elongated sentences: Turning on the computer, John opened Frame maker and, after selecting a blank document and opening the graphics panel, chose a polygonal shape tool, which he filled with red shading and a black border while his mother brought him sandwiches, all of which contributed to him having a nice day. Then, deliberating between a black and white or a color layout,

John decided that for a publication that would be on the web as well as in print, he would need to create both types of documents, because the print would be too costly for color photos, while the web would be too dull for merely black and white, but this color vs. non-color dilemma was only the tip of the iceberg for John in Frame maker, for he knew neither how to create anchored frames for his graphics, nor how to manipulate the sizes and resolutions of the photos he wanted to import, which was giving him a headache, despite his mother's nice sandwiches. (Combining sentences is fun up to a point, and then it gets ridiculous.)

Perfect mix of short and long: After turning on the computer, John opened Frame maker and selected a blank document. He then opened the graphics panel, chose a polygonal shape tool, and filled it with red shading and a black border. His mother brought him sandwiches, which made his day nice. 4.7.3 Avoid sexist pronouns.

Although in the past it was acceptable to use "he" when referring to both men and women, it is no longer acceptable to do so now. Why? Because linguists found that language use actually does have an impact on the way people think and act. If pronouns are always "he," and certain professions are always **fireman**, **policeman**, **chairman**, **congressmen**, etc., then it is more likely that men - by simple virtue of the privileged masculine pronoun and noun use - will fill those positions, and that women will feel that they do not belong in them. Avoiding sexist pronouns will help you find liberation from these restricting gender roles.

Even if you disagree with the above theory, using "he" only pronouns is a practice that is no longer tolerated. You should instead choose to pluralize your subject and use "they" or "their" when referring back to that subject. Alternatively, you can choose "he or she," but if you need to write "he or she" more than twice in the sentence, you might give your reader a headache. Try to avoid "s/he" or "he/she" simply because it is unsightly.

4.7.4 Avoid the bias of using gendered pronouns. To do so,

- Rephrase the sentence
- Use plural nouns or plural pronouns this way you can use "they" or "their"
- Replace the pronoun with an article instead of "his," use "the"
- Drop the pronoun many sentences sound fine if you just omit the troublesome "his" from the sentence

Replace the pronoun with a noun such as "person," "individual," "child," "researcher,"
 etc.

Example:

An incompetent manager cannot run a company in an excellent fashion, nor can he or she make a friendly relationship with their/the employees.

Note:

→ ➤ Even for singular nouns or pronouns you can use the pronoun "they."

One can improve his or her knowledge by doing their best.

More examples:

Sexist: If a medical <u>student</u> wants to succeed, <u>he</u> has to learn to budget his time wisely.

Liberated: If medical students want to succeed, they have to learn to budget their time wisely.

4.7.5 Maintain a level of formality

Just as in daily life, in writing you naturally adjust the level of formality of your writing style to the situation and audience. You may use one level of formality with your teacher, and another level with your best friend. In an academic essay, be sure to maintain a formal voice. One way to adjust your level of formality is by avoiding contractions (i.e., using "do not" instead of "don't").

Hyper-formal: The degree to which private controversial moralities are decriminalized by the federal government depends on the extent of their injurious repercussions on an otherwise benign society.

Too informal: The feds will start putting pervs in the slammer if they feel their smutty actions are mixin' up good men and women.

Just right: Whether private immoralities are outlawed by the government or not depends on the harm they inflict on public society.

To maintain a level of formality, AVOID...

- beginning a sentence with a conjunction (e.g. But, And, Or, So, Yet)
- contractions (e.g. can't, won't, doesn't)
- using the word you. Use "one", "a person", "any/every individual", and so forth.
- using the imperative or command form (e.g. Watch this film.)
- abbreviations (e.g. or etc. instead of and so forth)
- short sentences and short paragraphs
- stories in the text that are too personal or too compelling.

5. Academic Skills for TOEFL Writing

5.1 Paraphrasing¹

The word paraphrase means "to express what somebody has said or written using different words". In the TOEFL, you will also be tested on your ability to paraphrase parts of the text. This means you must know how to rewrite sentences by using other words and phrases without changing the original meaning. The TOEFL tests your ability in this area because when you do research in college, you are not allowed to copy and paste scholars' works directly. Instead, you should paraphrase and integrate the scholars' works with your own." This skill is used in all the four modules of Reading, Listening, Writing, and Speaking in the TOEFL iBT Test. Therefore, it is worth learning this key skill.

5.1.1 Necessary Skills

- Understanding the original text accurately
- Using your own words to convey essential information and ideas from the reading and the lecture
- Being able to express the same information using different vocabulary and sentence structure

5.1.2 The Process of Paraphrasing

- Understand the full meaning of the original text.
- Take notes on the passage. Write down key information including a few phrases, major points, and important details.
- WITHOUT looking at the original passage, paraphrase the information in your own words, just by looking at your notes.
- Check the original passage for any missed key information.

5.1.3 Strategies

1. Use related words and phrases, including synonyms and antonyms of words and concepts in the original passage.

Example:

The average daytime temperature in the Gobi desert does not often go below 38°C.

The average daytime temperature in the Gobi desert is usually at or above 38°C.

2. Change word forms, and rephrase to make things simpler.

Example: For organization \rightarrow in order to organize

3. Use different sentence structure.

Example: Many Asian countries export rice to North America.

Rice is exported to North America by many Asian countries.

4. Change the order of presentation of the information.

5. Cite information from the original source by using signal words.

Example: According to the professor/passage...

The professor says/mentions/states/argues/believes/found that...

Example¹:

Original Statement: The hardest woodwind instrument to learn is the oboe.

Unacceptable Paraphrase: The *most difficult* woodwind instrument to learn is the oboe.

Why is the first paraphrase unacceptable? Did you notice that only one word was different from the original statement? Remember that substituting one synonym is not a restatement and not an acceptable paraphrase.

Now, look at an acceptable paraphrase:

Original Statement: The hardest woodwind instrument to learn is the oboe.

Acceptable Paraphrase: The *most difficult* woodwind instrument to *master* is the oboe.

Why is the second paraphrase acceptable? Did you notice that more than one synonym was different? The phrase *most difficult* was substituted for the word *hardest* and the word *master* was substituted for the word learn. But this paraphrase is still very close to the original sentence.

This is an improvement in paraphrasing:

Original Statement: The hardest woodwind instrument to learn is the oboe.

Excellent Paraphrase: The oboe is the most difficult woodwind instrument to master.

Why is this paraphrase considered excellent? Like the acceptable paraphrase, more than one synonym was different. The phrase *most difficult* was substituted for the word *hardest* and the word *master was* substituted for the word *learn*. Did you also see how the structure of the sentence changed? The subject of the original statement was *the hardest woodwind*

Some great techniques of paraphrasing are as follows:

A) Use Phrases¹

There is a tendency to try to find one word to paraphrase, but **phrases** can be a useful alternative.

Practical Strategy

The English language contains many phrasal verbs that express the same meaning as a one-word verb.

In general, the phrasal verbs used for informal writing and speaking, and the one-word verb is used for more formal language. Some of the phrasal verbs that are common to academic language are listed here.

B) Make an Explanation¹

→ Sometimes even native speakers cannot retrieve a word from memory when they are paraphrasing, especially when they are speaking. When this happens to you, there are several ways to compensate for the word that has slipped your mind.

Practical Strategy

- a) If it is an adjective, you can use an opposite adjective with the word not. For example, if a synonym for the adjective large slips your mind, you can say, not small.
 The sum was not small.
- b) If it is a verb, you can use a general verb instead of a specific synonym. For example, if you forget the synonym for the verb rely on, you can say, use, which is a very general verb that includes many meanings. Early traders used barter instead of money to exchange goods.
- c) If it is a noun, you can describe the noun with a descriptive phrase or clause. For example, if you forget the synonym for the noun farmer or if the word farmer slips your mind, you can describe it by saying, the person who engages in agriculture.

These compensatory strategies are used to get out of a problem when you are speaking. They should be used as a last resort instead of stopping when you are speaking.

2. Read and Listen for Meaning

When you read or listen for meaning, you learn to think about the ideas that the writer or speaker is communicating, not the individual words or grammar used.

By focusing on sentences or even paragraphs, you will train your mind to make connections and comprehend the ideas instead of trying to understand word by word. The important question is this: What does the author or the lecturer mean? What ideas are being expressed?
