Waste Water Treatment Plant groundbreaking

The City of Freeport hosted an official groundbreaking on Tuesday for the Freeport Waste Water Treatment Facility Phase 1 upgrade project in Freeport at 308 S. Hancock Ave.

This \$60 million Phase 1 Plant upgrade includes chemically enhanced primary treatment, new head works, a new lab building with offices, and installation of ultraviolet treatment equipment. The upgrade will increase the quality of water that is returned to the environment and will help to protect aquatic life and the environment. This project is phase 1 of 5 needed at this facility. The City is receiving infrastructure funding from an Illinois Environmental Protection Agency State Revolving Fund to construct Phase 1 as well as \$5 million in forgivable loans.



Roadwork update

Road construction is wrapping up on Pearl City Road and starting on Locust Ave. Pearl City Road has been closed off to traffic since April 15. That project, costing over million-dollar project, has detoured a majority of the Freeport community as they travel through western Freeport and out to Highland

Community College and beyond. Hot-mix asphalt has already been laid and now all that's left is ditch remediation. Regular traffic should return by July 1. The next City project is Locust Avenue, east of Freeport High School. Crews plan to use the summer to get this project complete before school is back in session in the Fall.

Gran Fonda Bike Ride Against Cancer

The FHN Gran Fonda Bike Ride Against Cancer is coming up on June 29! Enjoy a healthy bike ride through some of the most beautiful roads in northwest Illinois while fighting cancer! The ride begins at 8 a.m. at the Tutty's Crossing Trailhead at 250 E. Stephenson Street with your choice of 30-, 50-, and 75-mile paved routes as well 40- and 50-mile gravel routes and a short 5-mile out-and-back Family Fun Ride.

Dave Fonda, the founder of and inspiration for this event, loved cycling and his community. He started this fundraiser in 2007, dedicated to parlaying his passion into a cause that could help those fighting cancer even after losing his own battle with the disease in 2018.

Dedicated cyclers may recognize the term "Gran Fondo," which means 'big ride' in Italian. In Europe, Gran Fondos are mass participation cycling events that have enjoyed huge popularity for decades and have spread around the globe. We have kept Dave Fonda at the heart of this event by editing the name of these world-famous rides to name the Freeport event in his honor.

VOICES Garden Walk Fundraiser

VOICES of Stephenson County is showcasing five gardens and offering a variety of activities with its annual fundraising Garden Walk on Saturday, June 22. According to Beth Maskell, Executive Director for VOICES of Stephenson County, the gardens and activities represent a little bit of everything. "Two gardens have touches of history, another is rural and expansive, one is more compact, one is set at a

school and another is designed to heal. The gardens truly are stunning, each in their own way," said Maskell.

Garden Walk 2024 will run from 9 a.m. to 2 p.m. on Saturday. The cost is \$20 per person, with those 12 and younger free. Tickets are now on sale at Cub Foods, Deininger Floral and the VOICES Book Nook, all in Freeport. Tickets also will be available the day of the sale at each of the gardens. If needed, a rain date is set for Sunday, June 23 and will be announced on VOICES' Facebook page.

Each featured garden will include a related activity, such as a silent auction, a pop-up Book Nook store of garden- and flower-related books, advice from University of Illinois Master Gardeners, and even an Iced Tea Part with Barbies!

VOICES uses gardening as therapy when working with survivors of domestic and sexual violence, and all profits benefit their clients. It also operates the VOICES Survivors Shelter and the VOICES Book Nook. Last year, it assisted more than 800 survivors. Walnut Acres star rating

Walnut Acres Nursing Home in Freeport has earned a three-star rating from the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid according to Mike Phillippo, Chief Financial Officer for Transitional Care Management, a nursing home management firm that began work with Walnut Acres since June 2022.

The rating can be found online at Medicare.gov, which rates many but not all of the country's nursing homes on a 1-to-5-star system, with 5 being the best. The rating is based on the building itself, staff, resident outcomes, and health inspection results. When Transitional Care Management started managing Walnut Acres in June 2022, they were rated a 1-star facility. By 1 October 2023 they received a 2-star rating and in April 2024 they received a 3-star rating. Phillippo noted that key data points are averaged over a 3-year period.

Phillippo attributed these results to having current, data-driven goals; a management that understands the changing rules and regulations of oversight bodies like the Illinois Department of Health, the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid, Centers for Disease Control, and others, and having a strong clinical training staff to assist local providers in meeting standards.
