As with past conventions, this one was filled with energy and excitement, but it was even more so because this year **Saint Joseph Council 11370 in Maumee** won the International Community Program for their *Off the Streets Toledo* program:

Off the Streets Toledo was founded in 2021 to help both individuals and families move from homelessness to stable housing. Since its launch, more than 1,000 men, women and children have moved into safe, dignified homes thanks to the council's efforts. Council members meet with those in need, provide security deposits, manage warehouse inventory, deliver furniture, appliances, and other material needs, programith needs and offer them a Pible and empirical production.

appliances, and other material needs, pray with recipients and offer them a Bible and crucifix as a sign of faith and encouragement - more than 175 crucifixes hang on the walls of participating families thanks to this effort. In addition, the council hosts multiple fundraising activities to provide ongoing support to the initiative.

Brothers of Saint Joseph Council, on behalf of your brother Knights around Ohio, I would like to extend my sincere gratitude for your exceptional charitable work and extend my heartfelt congratulations on this remarkable honor. You have undoubtedly answered the "Call" of service to your community.

On our way home from DC, Heather and I had the opportunity to attend Mass and visit with former State Chaplain Father Wayne Morris in Ironton. At the end of Mass Father Wayne gave me

time to introduce myself and say a few words about the Knights. As we were leaving, four young adults approached us to find out more about information about our Order. They were part of a youth organization from Dayton (small world) and were interested in having myself or another Knight speak at one of their future meetings. I look forward to the forthcoming opportunity. When we receive information indicating a growing interest in the faith among young adults aged 18 to 24, it is undoubtedly accurate, and I have personally observed this now on several occasions.



Star Council Award Update

I received a report from Supreme listing the following: **64 councils** will receive the Star Council Award, which includes the Columbian, McGivney and Founder's Awards. **22 councils** will receive the Columbian Award. **17 Councils** will receive both the Columbian and Founder's Awards. **2 councils** will receive both the Columbian and McGivney Awards. **2 councils** will receive the Columbian, Founder and McGivney Awards. **10 councils** will receive the Founder's

Award. 19 councils will receive the McGivney Award. And 2 councils will receive the McGivney and Founder's Awards. A complete list of these awards will be included with the September Star Council Report distributed in early September.



This a reminder that the Ohio State Council will be holding a Mid-Year Star Council Award Incentive Drawing at the District Deputy Mid-Year Meeting on January 9-10, 2026, in Columbus. To qualify for this drawing, a council must accomplish the following by January 1, 2026:

- 1. Have the Form 365 and Form 185 submitted.
- 2. Have all four council officers either "compliant" or "pending" for Safe Environment.
- 3. Have at least one Fraternal Benefit Event credited with 50% of your council's participation quota.
- 4. Achieve 50% of your council's membership quota.
- 5. Have 2 activities credited in each of the 4 Faith in Action categories of the "We are Called" Program Contest.


For every 20 councils that qualify, there will be four \$100 Walmart gift cards for our drawing. Please start working on the Star Council Award **NOW**!

Please note that receiving this "Oscar" award does not necessarily mean your council will achieve the Star Council Award from Supreme as of June 30. but they should. We encourage all councils not to wait until June to complete their Star Council Award requirements. Please start working on the Star Council Award NOW!

My brother Knights,

As a culture, we are enamored with superheroes. The "Marvel cinematic universe," an umbrella term for a series of superhero movies, TV shows, comics, games, and other related media has been an unprecedented success; just the movies alone have brought over \$30 billion in the years since the first one was released in 2008. And for normal people like us, there is something captivating about watching these amazing superheroes tap into their mysterious superpowers to save the day.

But the reality is... we already have at our fingertips the power to save the world. Blessed Pope Pius IX once said, "Give me an army praying the rosary and I will conquer the world." As a Dominican friar, I wear a rosary as part of my religious habit. And all of the friars always wear the rosary on their belt on their **left** hip. I'm guessing many of you might not know the reason why. It's because, in medieval times, men (presuming they were right-handed) wore

Supreme Resolutions to Know About

At this year's Supreme Convention in Washington, D.C., in August, two specific resolutions were passed that will directly affect each council in the order. Below is a brief summary of each resolution and a link to the actual resolution as posted on Supreme Council's website - **kofc.org**.



• Removal of the Admissions Committee - Section 108, which stipulates the appointment of an Admission Committee, be repealed

Repealing Section 108 and Amending Sections 109 and 114 of the Laws of the Knights of Columbus

• Change to the number of audits conducted by councils from two per year to only one annual audit - date not specified, but more than likely to coincide with the fraternal year (July 1-June 30)

Amending Section 145 of the Laws of the Knights of Columbus

Know Your Requirements

Worthy Brother Knights of the Great State of Ohio,

As I mentioned last month, Supreme Council is rolling out 8 new programs this fraternal year. Each program category (Community, Family, Faith, and Life) will have 2 programs added to it. Supreme has already rolled out the 2 new ones under Community (Celebrating Our Heritage

and Bright Futures). The other 6 will be rolled out one at a time for the rest of the calendar year.

These programs address the needs and interests of Hispanic and Catholic parishes and communities. They attract potential members. They increase participation among existing members. They build bridges between Anglo and Hispanic communities within parishes.

This year, a series of program trainings will be produced for the first time from Supreme.

There will be Fraternal Trainings on how to run these programs. Each training will be for a specific program, and will be available in both Spanish and English.

This month, I am going to emphasize getting the administrative tasks done. For those councils that have not yet submitted their Form 185 (Report of Officers) and their Form 365 (Program Personnel), please do so as soon as possible. Submitting these forms in a timely fashion is the only way to let Supreme know who needs to receive council leadership information and programming communications throughout the fraternal year. The Form 365 is also important so those who need to be Youth Compliant get the information they need to get it done! Not to mention both the Form 185 and Form 365 are required to not only max out the administrative activities, but also the We Are Called State General Program contest as well.

The same goes for submitting the Semi-Annual Council Audit, <u>Form 1295</u>. These audits are necessary to maintain the bonding on council treasurers and financial secretaries. Also, the submission of the Semi-Annual Council Audit, **Form 1295**, is a requirement to max out the administrative activities and the We Are Called State General Program contest just like the **Form 185** and **Form 365** are.

Lastly, State Per Capita is now due. If your council has already paid for its State Per Capita, thank you for doing so in a timely manner. For those councils who have not yet paid their State Per Capita, please do so as soon as possible! Just like the **Form 185**, **Form 365** and the Semi-Annual Council Audit, **Form 1295**, paying your State Per Capita is a requirement to max out the administrative activities and the We Are Called State General Program contest.

- Padre Pio (Sept 23): endured suffering and scandal with faith and love.

The Archangels, St. Michael, St. Gabriel, St. Raphael (Sept 29): defends us in spiritual battle.

The Battle Within

Virtue is the foundation of strength, the habit of choosing the good. The muscle memory of the soul. Vice, on the other hand, is the enemy's counterfeit: habitual sin that slowly steals a man's strength. Lust. Anger. Pride. Sloth. Envy. These spiritual cancers grow best when no one's watching.

But you don't have to be perfect. You have to fight.

This fight begins in the heart. It's a battle between your lower instincts and your higher calling. Our world trains men to react, not to reflect. To escape, not to endure. To perform, not to persevere. But virtue is forged in discipline, prayer, silence, and accountability.

- Virtue Night: Teach the cardinal virtues. Pair each with a saint. Let men reflect, share, and set goals.
- Vice Inventory: Name your vice. Name its opposite. Make a plan. Share it with a brother.
- Confession & Prayer: Start the Litany of St. Joseph. Pray it daily. Make it yours.
- 30-Day Challenge: Track one virtue. One act a day. Pray. Reflect. Repeat.

Accountability Partner: One man. One check-in a week. One path to progress.

This is how we become the men God created us to be.

Be a man of justice. Be a man of courage. Be a man of prayer.

You are not fighting alone.

You are training with the saints.

We Are Called. We Are Equipped.

Excerpts from the Fourth Degree Update - August 2025

September, October, and November are great months to focus on the Warriors to Lourdes Program. It is a smaller pilgrimage within the International Military Pilgrimage, which began in 1946 to promote reconciliation and peace after World War II. Ever since, for one weekend in May, Lourdes, France, has become a place of prayer and healing for active-duty military and veterans representing more than forty nations. The Knights of Columbus, in partnership with the Archdiocese for the Military Services, USA, provides the opportunity and means for our non-wounded, wounded, ill, and injured U.S. warriors to participate in the Warriors to Lourdes pilgrimage for a period of prayer and spiritual guidance. All expenses for approved non-wounded, wounded, ill, or injured military personnel, as well as their designated caregiver, are covered by the Knights of Columbus Charities, Inc.

- This is an incredible opportunity for assemblies and councils to hold a joint breakfast or dinner, with the proceeds dedicated to this program.
- Another idea is to hold a special collection during a specific weekend in September, October, and November. With the approval of the parish priest, the Fourth Degree could wear their regalia at Mass to collect donations. (this has been approved by Ron Boyce, PSD, Supreme's Fourth Degree Director of Programs)

Application & Companion Information:

If you know a Warrior who wishes to apply to join or would like to volunteer as a companion for the pilgrimage, please visit the Warriors to Lourdes website www.warriorstolourdes.com and fill out the 2026 Warrior to Lourdes Application by January 15, 2026.

Companions are invited to attend and may be offered needs-based financial assistance on a case-by-case basis with a validated Chaplain's certification of need. The AMS-K of C package rate for companions and volunteers traveling from the United States to Lourdes is \$3,000.00 for double occupancy and \$3,300.00 for a single occupancy room. All applications and payments are due by January 15, 2026. The applications are reviewed by the K of C pilgrimage leadership team and medical director for selection. All applicants are notified of the status of their application beginning February 15, 2026.


