

Board Meetings

It may not be possible or advisable for a Board to meet in person due to the current state of the COVID-19 pandemic.

But our Association doesn't just stop operating. So how do we navigate these unique challenges?

Board Meeting Information

Meetings are usually held at the Clubhouse on the 3rd Tuesday of each month at 6 PM. All interested homeowners are encouraged to contact the Community Manager prior to the meeting to verify meeting time, place and date in case of any changes.

Ohio law allows a Condominium Board to meet by way of electronic or telephone conference call, as long as each member of the board can hear, participate, and respond to every other board member. So even though it may not be possible or advisable to meet in person, we will be able to use technology that allows board members to attend and participate in meetings from their home.

Management & Maintenance

Condo Management of Columbus qualifies as an essential business, and they will be doing their very best to continue to manage our community on a daily basis. Of course there may be circumstances that make operating as usual particularly difficult, but CMOC will do everything they can to operate within the law and in the best interests of our Association.

If you have any concerns, you are able to reach out to our Community Association Manager as usual. The Association intends to continue providing for the maintenance of the common elements, collecting assessments, and enforcing the rules. But we certainly appreciate your patience as we adjust to the various challenges that arise.

Annual Owners Meetings

There is a lot of uncertainty regarding what to expect for Annual Owners Meetings. Whether it be the CDC recommendation to avoid group meetings of more than 50 people, the President's recommendation to avoid groups of more than 10 people, or the Governor's Stay at Home Order, many Annual Owners Meetings need to be rescheduled.

The Association is required to hold an election meeting every year, and there are no provisions in our governing documents

Love Your Dog, Leash Your Dog

We love dogs-we really do. That's why the association is committed to enforcing the county leash law on association property. According to the U.S. Humane Society, an unleashed dog has an average life span of less than four years. Allowing your dog to run free threatens your dog's health and welfare and the happiness it brings to you.

We also love our community. That's another reason the association is committed to enforcing the county leash law-so all residents may enjoy our community.



We trust we can count on you for voluntary compliance with the leash law. We don't like to call animal control, but we won't have any choice if your dog is running free.

As a reminder, cats also fall under this restriction. It is against Association rules to allow cats to roam free outside without a leash.

Please Pick Up After Your Pet

It doesn't take much to remember that we have pets in our community. In fact, if you don't watch your step, you're liable to step in one such reminder! Besides being unsightly and smelly, animal waste can be hazardous to the health of our children who play in the community and other pets. One of the most common forms of disease

transmission between dogs is through fecal matter. When walking your dog in our community, remember that it should be leashed. Also, it is important to remember to immediately clean up after your pet. Take along a baggie with you to pick up waste with and then dispose of it properly. By taking a few simple steps to clean up after your pet, you can contribute not only to the beautification of our community, but also towards the elimination of one of the most irritating nuisances in our community. It Takes a Village...

Smoke Alarms

Did you know the life expectancy for smoke detectors is approximately 10 years? If the smoke alarms in your unit are at or near this age you should consider investigating options for your style of alarm. If you have WIRED alarms to avoid replacement, there is an easy fix available that can cost less than having to rewire or install new alarms.

An adaptor kit (see below) is available online for purchase. It is the owners' responsibility to ensure those alarms are up to date. Some of your individual insurances may require this to be done as well.

Healthy Chocolate Chip Cookies

Ingredients

- 1 ½ cups bananas (mashed)
- 1 teaspoon almond extract
- ¼ cup coconut oil (room temperature)
- 2 cups rolled oats
- 1/3 cup ground sunflower seeds
- 1/3 cup cacao powder
- 1/3 cup coconut, finely shredded and unsweetened
- ½ teaspoon fine sea salt
- 1 teaspoon baking powder
- 6 oz chocolate chips

Instructions

- 1. Preheat oven to 350 degrees, racks in the top third.
- 2. In a large bowl combine bananas, almond extract, and coconut oil. Set aside.

- 3. In a separate bowl whisk together the oats, sunflower seeds, cacao powder, shredded coconut, salt, and baking powder.
- 4. Add the dry ingredients to the wet ingredients and stir until combined.
- 5. Fold in the chocolate chips. (The dough is a bit looser than normal cookie dough, that's by design.)
- 6. Use an ice cream scoop, if available, to scoop dough and place about an inch apart on a parchment lined baking
- 7. Bake for 13 15 minutes or until golden on bottoms.

Cook Time 15 minutes
