


Golf Cart Storage will once again be offered for the winter in West Wind Hall and Riverside Hall. As above, please sign up at the office for this.

Recipes and Tidbits

Crustless Summer Zucchini Pie

10 oz shredded zucchini (all liquid squeezed out)
¼ cup chopped fresh chives
2 tbsp grated parmesan cheese
1 tsp baking powder
1 tsp olive oil
½ tsp kosher salt
Cooking spray

- ½ cup shallots (chopped)
 ½ cup part skim mozzarella
 ½ cup white whole wheat flour
 2/3 cup fat free milk
 2 large eggs (beaten)
 fresh cracked pepper to taste
- 1. Preheat oven to 400 deg. Lightly spray a pie dish with cooking spray.
- 2. Combine zucchini, shallots, chives and mozzarella cheese in a bowl.
- 3. Sift flour and baking powder in a medium bowl.
- 4. Add remaining ingredients to the bowl and blend well.
- 5. Combine with zucchini mixture and pour it into the pie dish.
- 6. Top with parmesan cheese and bake 30-35 minutes or until knife comes out clean from the center.
- 7. Let it stand at least 5 minutes before serving.
