PBGA-OKIKI CUP PLAYOFFS



Toward the end of the season (Aug-Sep), competitions will culminate into higher stake events referred to as our PBGA-OKIKI CUP Playoffs. Much like the PGA Tour's version of the FEDEX Cup Playoffs, points will increase, prize money will increase and progressively players are whittled away out of the playoffs until we are left with our final event, The Tour Championship, where we will see our top echelon of players battling with everything on the line. It will be exciting golf and entertaining for all involved.

Here is how it will work:

- The playoffs will comprise the 4 weekends, 24 & 25 August, 31 August & 1 September, 7 & 8 September, and then our final week 14 & 15 September 2019.
- PBG \$ will be introduced and players will win these \$ as lesson credits. The PBG \$ will represent our OKIKI Cup Playoff points, with the highest earner at the end of the playoffs being awarded our OKIKI Cup Champion for 2018-19 Season.
- To be eligible for the playoffs, rankings from the PBG Tour OOM points will be used. The top 24 from the OOM list as after the last event before the playoffs commence, after Sunday 18 August 2019, will be offered to take part in the playoffs. Anyone opting out of the playoffs, the next player in the list will be offered the spot, and so and so forth, until we get a full field of 24 players.

- o 1st Playoff Event Forest Yuan Trophy 18 holes @ Mandai 24/25 Aug 2019
 - There will be a cut after the first 9-holes where only the top 20 (plus ties) will progress to the 2nd round and 2nd playoff event.
- 2nd Playoff Event Kranji Mandai 18 holes 31 Aug/1 Sep 2019
 - The top 16 will progress to the next playoff event.
 - No cut for this event
- \circ 3rd Playoff Event Kranji 18 holes 7/8 Sep 2019
 - The top 12 will progress to the finals, where all points are reset depending on ranking before the final event.
 - No cut for this event
- FINAL Playoff Event The Tour Championship @ Ria Bintan 18 holes 14/15 Sep 2019
 - Every player to make it through to the Tour Championship has the chance to be champion of the PBGA-OKIKI Cup depending on how everyone plays.
 - All players prizemoney will be set at the start of the event depending on their ranking coming into the event, the higher the ranking, the more you start with. It will be an advantage to have a higher ranking.
