CRCM Safety Corner

Please review the safety rules posted at the field and on the website.

- Over flight of the pits, wastewater facility and solar farm should be avoided.
- Low passes over the runway are allowed if you are the only one in the air. Otherwise please limit low passes to the dirt on the far side of the runway
- Do not forget **ON THE FIELD, TAKEOFF, TOUCH AND GO, LANDING, CLEAR, and DEADSTICK** callouts
- When over flying the bike path do so at above 50 feet or more

Safety tip: When you lose your engine in the upwind (just after takeoff) when taking off to the west consider a 90 degree left turn instead of a right turn. There is a few hundred feet of flat open dirt east of the pits whereas to the right you are likely to end up in a tree or the bike path. Try and remain inside the fence. If you do lose a plane behind either the solar field or the wastewater facility fence do not attempt to retrieve it yourself. There is contact information on the field bulletin board and someone will retrieve it for you.

COVID-19

The club will continue to follow in accordance with Pima County's face covering mandate. If you are unable to continually maintain a social distance of 6 feet, a face covering is REQUIRED.
