### Maine's OES Website

Many questions that members ask can be answered on the Grand Chapter of Maine's website which can be explored by anyone. Sister Kathy Williamson is the Web Administrator.

When you go to [maineoess.org](http://maineoess.org) it commences with a home page. If you scroll to the bottom of that page, you will find a button that says "FIND OUT MORE". Click on it and it automatically takes you to a page with words across the top: Home, About Us, Calendar, Newsletter, Maine Chapters, Our Grand Family, Contact Us and the last one is More. One can explore by clicking on one of those words. It takes you to information that is appropriate to that title. When you want to return to the former page, you simply click on the back arrow that is to the left of the https line.
