Adah would have to be a loving daughter to so willingly offer to keep her father's vow. Jephthah must have thought a household animal would come through the door; we can hardly imagine the horror he felt when it was his daughter in her excitement that ran to meet him. So it is that we learn of fidelity and have the sword and veil in her honor.

Can you imagine the devotion of a young woman who would be willing to travel to a land where she knew no one, in order to see to the care of her mother-in-law? Ruth did just that and worked long and hard hours, gleaning in the fields so that they might eat. The sheaf not only reminds us that Ruth was a gleaner but also that if we work and save for our infirm years, we will reap as we have sewn.

Esther was an obedient Jewish girl who was chosen to be the new queen when the king divorced his wife. She must have been a beautiful woman and was surely courageous. Few among us would risk losing favor and most likely our life to save the lives of others. The crown and scepter reminds us of the story of Esther.

Martha, Mary and Lazarus were siblings living in Bethany and known to be friends of Jesus. Such faith Martha displayed when her brother died and she asked Jesus to raise him from the dead. Although dead for four days, Lazarus was brought back from the dead because of Martha's trustful faith. We use a broken column to remind us of the uncertainty of human life.

Who can be absolutely certain that we would embrace a cross rather than trample it under foot, knowing that the penalty for doing so was death? We can pray for the strength and certainty of our faith to do just as Electa did. May we also practice charity and hospitality, as represented by the cup.

None of these stories would have meaning for us if it were not for our faith in God and the teaching of His word, which we find in the Holy Bible. We consider our altar to be sacred – we took our obligation there, we lay flowers there to remember loved ones gone before us, and it is central in our meeting rooms. We join 'round it at the close of our meetings to say farewell to each other, and ask God's blessing upon us until we meet again.
