Hunter's Open Skeet Shoot Review

Springfield Rod and Gun Club hosted 38 shooters at the Hunter's Open. Paul Giambrone added excitement to the event by presenting a Kolar work shop and shooting with participants. Paul is a seventeen time World Champion. He used his expertise to present a work shop with tips to improve skeet games after Doubles. Paul answered questions and provided very personalized information to shooters.

The shoot began with Doubles on Friday afternoon. Bill Spurlock was the gun champ with the score of 96, Mark Presnell, Runner-up with 95, Jim Perpich took A1, Collin Simpson B1, Carter Finnell C1 followed by Alan Young D1. Paul Giambrone participated in the Doubles event and shot 99 targets only.

Saturday morning opened with perfect skeet weather. Bill Spurlock posted 100 straight for gun champ for 12 Gauge. Paul Giambrone shooting targets only posted a score of 100. Mark Presnell, Keith Haley, Jeffrey Nichols and Steve Simpson all posted scores of 98. Mark Presnell and Keith Haley had a shoot off for Runner-up and B1, B2 and B3, after the smoke cleared from the shoot off, Mark Presnell was victorious as Runner-up. Jim Perpich took A1 with 97, David Chancellor, new participant from Oklahoma took A1 with a score of 97, B1 with a 98 was Keith Haley, Collin Simpson C1 97, Cap Kovarik 91 for D1 and Caleb Miller E1 with a score of 92.
