

A week in the life ofThe Club President

It has been suggested that over the next few months, the committee and staff outline what they do, this article will be called "A week in the life of..." and I have been asked to do the first one. So, here goes!

A week in the life of a Club President involves many different roles. I try to be at the club as much as possible, that way, I hear directly from members and staff if there are any issues or ideas to be put to the committee and I am on hand to help anyone that needs it.

I chair the meetings, approving the agenda and minutes before they are sent out. These include the monthly committee meeting, and the yearly AGM and OGM, as well as any other Special Meetings that are called. This week, there are some more informal meetings for me to attend, such as with the builders (to discuss all the problems) and with Emma from Rayens Football Club.

I liaise closely with Kate (Secretary) on a regular basis regarding ongoing issues, mainly to do with the buildings or anything that arises and needs urgent attention. I also proof read the monthly newsletter she produces.

When we have a staff vacancy to fill, I hold the interviews along with the VP and Secretary. Thankfully, after a couple of years of having to do a lot of interviews, we now have a very loyal, hardworking team, most of whom have been with us for years now.

As President, I represent the club at the Annual Bowls Presentation and Dinner. This involves sponsoring and presenting an award and is one of the more enjoyable tasks of the role.

Most of you will know that the house next door is owned by the club and rented out. Along with Kate, I carry out a yearly inspection on the property to ensure that the house is in good repair.

When required, I assist with emptying of the fruit machines, this is usually to cover staff illness or holiday.

Every few weeks, the lounge is hired out to the union Unite to hold a meeting on a Sunday morning. I help Kate cook their breakfast (usually about 25 people) and, as this costs the club nothing in wages, it makes a good profit.

On a practical level, I can often be seen fixing guttering, mowing the lawn, fixing the toilets, draining radiators, changing light bulbs, selling bingo books and taking my turn on the door on a Saturday night. This is list not exhaustive and I pretty much do anything that needs doing (that doesn't require a certificate) and, there is a lot that needs doing on an old building like the Club!

At Christmas, I am often called upon to dress up as an Elf. I have no idea why!

I think this is one of the best clubs around and I am honoured to be the President of it. I am not a member of any other club and why would I want to be? It has a fabulous bunch of staff, committee and, of course, the members.
