GET TO KNOW YOUR FELLOW TCCAGOers: Joey Rumberger



The Treasure Coast Chapter of the AGO's current scholarship student is Joseph Rumberger. Joey grew up in a musical household in which his mother played the piano, his grandfather played the accordion (this seems to be a recurring theme in the musical background of TCCAGOers!), and his father played the guitar.

Joey began taking piano lessons from his mother at about age seven. He began formal lessons four years ago on the piano at age 11. He remembers that the first pieces he really enjoyed were Beethoven's "Für Elise," and the first movement of the "Moonlight Sonata."

Joey's figured out that he had "perfect

pitch" while quite young. His interest in organ began about 2 years ago, and was sparked by interest in reed organs. He read about trackers, and from there developed an interest.

Joey enjoys antiques, and the old reed organs that were so popular 150 years ago caught his attention. For one thing, they share a number of similarities with the accordion. He was hooked, and began to restore an old organ given him in 2019. When it was completed, he donated that instrument to First Baptist Church in Fellsmere where, along with the piano, it is used every Sunday. The pastor's wife, Nancy Sparkman, was Joey's piano teacher.

The latest project is the restoration of a reed organ for Dr Adams. Since May of 2021, Joey has been making the wood and metal parts, while fabric and leather can easily be purchased from organ and piano supply houses.

Joey met Dr. Adams as a high school freshman, when Adams subbed for his music theory class. They talked "organ" and of course the idea of organ lessons came up. Joey was awarded the TCCAGO scholarship and began his studies.

During the lessons, Joey and Adams got into the subject of the reed organ. Adams had owned one for some time, and was hoping to get it restored some day. So it was decided that Joey would go ahead and do the restoration.

Organists sometimes play music

written for the harmonium. These pieces are mostly for French art harmonia. America's parlor organs are simpler and were mass produced to be affordable - not as complex as the French harmonia which are used in concert and orchestral works. Another big difference is that the French art harmonia work with positive wind pressure, while the simpler reed organs use suction.

Joey notes that music has definitely opened a lot of doors, and given him a lot of opportunities. He is passionate about music, especially when others enjoy it. He is planning to go into music as a career, though which college and detailed plans are still to be worked out.

Joey hopes to be successful in these endeavors; and wants to use that success to touch people, and enrich the lives of others; and to inspire young people to enjoy music.

We are delighted to have such a fine young man as our TCCAGO scholarship student!



THE MUSIC OF CHRISTMAS




Our first Christmas event in quite a while was offered on January 4 – "The Music of Christmas."


