

Christ Church will be dedicating their new Ahlborn-Galanti / Haupterk organ, and Brady Johnson's will discuss and demonstrate the organs of the Hauptwerk with various recital pieces. Please make an effort to support Brady and see this extraordinary event. Mark your calendars.



Now we are moving toward Lent and then Easter, and preparing for the Holy Days means we will be extremely busy. Easter is April 9th this year, so take a breath...

... and get ready for an amazing event on April 30th at 4:00 pm at St Andrew's Episcopal Church in Fort Pierce on the new A.E. Schlueter pipe organ. Our board member, Tom Goetz (organist and choirmaster at St Andrew's), is inviting us to attend the inaugural performance of the instrument with Dr. David Hurd performing. Michael Barone, host of "Pipedreams" will be there providing expert commentary.

Here is a little about David Hurd-



David Hurd is widely recognized as one of the foremost church musicians and concert organists in the United States, with a long list of honors and achievements, and immeasurable expertise in organ performance, improvisation, and composition. For 39 years David Hurd was on the faculty of The General Theological Seminary in New York City, as Director of Chapel Music, Organist, and Professor of Church Music.

He is the composer of dozens of hymns, choral works, settings of the liturgy, and organ works published by a number of major houses. His music appears in hymnals and choir libraries in churches of nearly all religious denominations.

In 2010 he became the fifteenth recipient of The American Guild of Organists' Distinguished Composer award. Dr. Hurd is now Organist/Choirmaster of the Church of St. Mary the Virgin in New York City.

As a concert organist, David Hurd

enjoys instant recognition having performed throughout North America and Europe, and featured at conventions of the American Guild of Organists. He was invited to perform at the Internationaal Orgelfestival Haarlem where he was awarded the diploma for improvisation at the Stitchting Internationaal Orgelconcours.

He studied both at the Preparatory
Division of the Juilliard School and at
Manhattan's High School of Music and
Art. Later he attended Oberlin
Conservatory, and went on for further
study at the University of North and at
the Manhattan School of Music. His
organ teachers have included Bronson
Ragan, Garth Peacock, Arthur Poister,
and Rudolph Kremer.

Now the ball is in your court. Don't let this opportunity to host events in the area go without support. I will be sending out an email blast to all of you as to how we contribute. It will be worth every penny.

Finally, I want to tell you that I worked very hard at St Andrews in Ft Pierce to raise money by catering events for the church to make this pipe organ a reality. We have a tentative agreement to hold our members recital there later in the year. To have an opportunity to play this instrument is a dream come true. Let's do this.

MEET YOUR FELLOW TCCAGOers: Kathleen Knott



Kathleen Knott grew up as the only child, a PK (preacher's kid) in a Methodist home. Her grandmother predicted she would play the piano one day since she was blessed with long fingers. And sure enough, she had a wonderful piano teacher during her adolescent years, and began filling in on the organ at her father's church.

After graduating high school Kathleen attended Mary Washington College in Virginia and graduated with a Music major. After being married and having 2 children, she received a Master of Music Education degree from University of Colorado (Boulder). It was there that she took organ lessons, and loved playing on the University's Casavant organ. Kathleen also achieved Orff Level 3 certification at the University of Nevada at Los Vegas.

Kathleen held organist/choir master positions at many churches, and

discovered that she felt most at home in playing in churches with a liturgical tradition.

She also taught music at various elementary schools. A highlight of her career was taking a group of students to perform at the National Orff Convention in Tampa in the 90's. The Orff approach emphasizes process and creativity.

Kathleen has been a member of the American Guild of Organists since early college years, and has served in several offices and positions. These include teaching adult novices the organ, orchestrating a "Pedals, Pipes & Pizza" event, and serving as both secretary and dean of our local Treasure Coast chapter.

Highlights of her tenure as chapter dean include putting on an Orff workshop and hosting Adam Brakel as guest organist at Evensong.

Kathleen feels blessed to know a multitude of wonderful church families. Most especially, she appreciates her church family at St. Mark's Anglican Church in Vero Beach where she has been employed since the doors opened on the new building in 2005. She especially loves and appreciates the beautiful and meaningful hymns that are part of the Anglican tradition.



Kathleen's hobbies include playing recreation golf. She has hit two holes in one, an accomplishment not many golfers ever experience even once! She also enjoys attending karaoke with her husband.

ORGAN DEDICATION AND DEMONSTRATION


Immediately following and flowing from the dedication ceremony the donor of this wonderful gift, Mr. Baden Griffin (a member and former

dean of TCCAGO), will give a background to his purchase of the organ and the unique addition of the virtual organs, which are accessed through the computer software known as Hauptwerk (German word for the Great organ division).



Interspersed throughout Baden's talk, Christ Church's organist, Brady Johnson, will perform organ works demonstrating the flavor of each virtual organ, as well as the original sound of the Ahlborn-Galanti instrument. The entire program should be 90 minutes.



CONCERT AND DISCUSSION from MIDNIGHT TOCATTA

On Sunday, February 12, 2023 at 6:00 pm, a festive concert and discussion premiering the winning entry of the Mader Fund's 50th Anniversary Composition Competition will be held at St. James'-In-The-City Episcopal Church (3903 Wilshire Blvd, Los Angeles, CA 90010).

Renowned concert organists Stephen Tharp and David Briggs will each perform their unique interpretation of "Midnight Toccatas for Solo Organ" by Aaron Travers, Associate Professor of Music Composition at Indiana University's Jacobs School of Music.

"Midnight Toccatas" was the winning work from among 42 entries in the

Ruth and Clarence Mader Memorial Scholarship Fund's 50th anniversary Composition Competition. The program will also include the organists' own transcriptions of "Ride of the Valkyries" (Wagner), "Carnival" (Dvorak), and "Daphnis et Chloe" (Ravel).

In addition, Dr. Frank Ticheli will interview Dr. Travers and moderate an audience Q & A following the concert.

The concert will be preceded by a Choral Evensong at 4:15 pm, featuring the choir of St. James', directed by Canon James Buonemani.
