



Jerry W. Myers, BME, MM, MM

Jerry was born and raised in York, Pennsylvania and became involved in church music as a teenager having studied piano since the age of seven and organ at thirteen. He holds a Bachelor's degree in Music Education from Grace College and Master's degrees from Ball State University and The University of Michigan. His teachers have included Kirby Koriath, Michele Johns and Marilyn Mason.

Jerry has held church positions both full and part time since 1980. He has been a music teacher in schools in Georgia and Florida for 32 years. A highlight was serving at May Howard School on Wilmington Island where he conducted a 70 member auditioned chorus and directed musicals such as Annie, Willy Wonka and Cinderella.

Performances include St. Mark's, Venice, Coral Ridge Presbyterian Church, Calvary Church, Charlotte, College of Wooster, Ohio, Alabama Theatre, Birmingham and staff organist at Atlanta's Fox Theatre.

In February, 2023, Jerry joined the staff of First United Methodist Church, Ft. Pierce, as Director of Music and Organist. Later this year the church will take delivery of an Allen organ model RL-66 which will include Aeolian-Skinner, Cavaille-Coll, Arp Schnitger, Schlicker and Wurlitzer suites.

Jerry is a member of the Organ Historical Society, American Theatre Organ Society, five AGO chapters and has served as Dean of the Ft. Lauderdale Chapter.
