
Interment will be at a later date in the columbarium of St. Paul's Cathedral in Buffalo, New York, where Don also served.

TCCAGO'ER OF THE MONTH AMBER SCHICHTEL

My high school choir teacher, Rachael Holloway, was a major motivator in my musicianship. She pushed me to grow, not just as a singer, but as an instrumentalist as well. After high school, I was encouraged by the choir director at IRSC, Dr. Rieth, to join the choir and a few other vocal groups. He offered me a scholarship through the music department and was always looking for opportunities for his students. During my time at IRSC, I realized that I wanted to pursue music as a career. Because of this, I joined the choir at St. Andrew's as a first step into the musical profession. Here, I met Dr. Davidson who was incredibly welcoming and supportive.



Before this, I did not think of myself as a professional by any means, but I have grown significantly through this experience. Lastly, Dr. Goetz has been a sincere advocate and mentor to me. He has set the bar extremely high for musicianship and professionalism. If it had not been for these wonderful people, I would not be where I am today.

A few of my family members are musicians. My uncle plays piano, my father plays the guitar and drums as a hobby, and my mother took piano lessons as a child. My mom thought it would be a good idea for me to do the same, so I took violin and piano lessons in elementary school. I joined choir in middle and high school, and I got involved in any music-related production that I could. In college, I started taking all the music courses that IRSC had to offer along with my required courses for accounting, which was my major at the time. A professor told me about the choir at St. Andrew's, and I auditioned to become the soprano section leader. I was introduced to the incredible pipe organ, and I have been enamored with it ever since.

I am most proud of pursuing music as a career. It was not a popular decision among some of my family members. My grandmother often jokes that I should be a "singing accountant." However, the greatest obstacle had been placed by myself. This path has filled me with joy, but also a great deal of doubt. Although I still feel occasionally inadequate, I have learned to give myself grace and push forward.


Math is another passion of mine. If I was not pursuing music, I would most likely go into a finance or math-related field. I originally started double-majoring in music and accounting while at IRSC, before I eventually transferred to the FAU music program.

My favorite instrument is the organ. It is such a majestic and versatile instrument. I could not pick one favorite piece of music, but Chopin's Ballade No. 1 in G Minor and Brahms' Intermezzo Op. 117 No. 2 both hold a special place in my heart.


