


















Making the Promise

 This  is called  being invested.







 Other children  may be invested  at the same  time  as me.

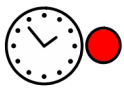
 At the investiture, everyone will  stand in a circle  or  horseshoe shape.
