<u>Definitions</u>

- "Number of Students Who Began the Program" means the number of students who began a program who were scheduled to complete the program within 100% of the published program length within the reporting calendar year and excludes all students who cancelled during the cancellation period.
- "Students Available for Graduation" is the number of students who began the program minus the number of students who have died, been incarcerated, or been called to active military duty.
 "Number of On-time Graduates" is the number of students who completed the program within
- 100% of the published program length within the reporting calendar year.

 "On-time Completion Bate" is the number of on-time or advised by the number of studen
- "On-time Completion Rate" is the number of on-time graduates divided by the number of students available for graduation.
- "150% Graduates" is the number of students who completed the program within 150% of the program length (includes on-time graduates).

STUDENT'S RIGHT TO CANCEL

1. The student has the right to cancel and obtain a refund of charges paid through attendance at
he first-class session, or the seventh (7th) day after enrollment, whichever is later. After the
end of the cancellation period, you also have the right to stop school at any time; and you have
he right to receive a pro rata refund if you have completed 60 percent or less of the scheduled
lays in the current payment period in your program through the last day of attendance.

2. Cancellation may occur when the student provides a written notice of cancellation at
he following address: Bakersfield Barber College, Inc. 2844 Niles Street, Bakersfield,
CA 93306. This can be done by mail or by hand delivery.

- 3. The written notice of cancellation, if sent by mail, is effective when deposited in the mail properly addressed with proper postage.
- 4. The written notice of cancellation need not take any particular form and, however expressed, it is effective if it shows that the student no longer wishes to be bound by the Enrollment Agreement.
- 5. If the Enrollment Agreement is cancelled the school will refund the student any money he/she paid, less a registration fee of \$75.00 and less deduction for tool kit of \$750.00, within 45 days after the notice of cancellation is received.

WITHDRAWAL FROM THE PROGRAM

You may withdraw from the school at any time after the cancellation period (described above) and receive a pro rata refund if you have completed 60 percent or less of the scheduled days in the current payment period in your program through the last day of attendance. The refund will be less a registration fee of \$75.00, pursuant to CCR 71750(c)(3). All amounts the student has paid shall be subject to refund unless the enrollment agreement and the refund policy outlined in the catalog specify amounts paid for a deposit not more than \$250.00. If cancelled after the 7 day period all moneys shall be refunded on a pro-rate basis, less registration fee of \$75.00 (non-refundable), less tool kit \$950.00 (non-refundable). Once purchased, the tool kit becomes the property of the student. Except when an institution provides a 100% refund pursuant to section 94919(d) or section 94920(b) of the Code, any assessment paid pursuant to section 94923 of the Code is non-refundable. If the student has completed more than 60% of the period of attendance for which the student was charged, the tuition is considered earned and the student will receive no refund. See Refund Policy VA for VA students.
