





"Preparing to Call a new Pastor"



Dear Members of Spirit of Joy,

I hope this message finds all of you well! It continues to be a joyful privilege to work with your leadership in preparing our congregation to enter a **call process for a new full-time pastor**. Given the rhythms of congregational life, we are working step by step to position ourselves to partner with the bishop's office of the Grand Canyon Synod in a call process.

One of the pivotal factors, of course, is that of our congregational financial picture. Simply put, that means demonstrating to ourselves, and the Synod, that we will be able to financially support a full-time pastor. This is an important goal to achieve as we prepare for the budget year 2026.

I have asked to be paid on a minimal basis as your Interim Pastor so that our congregation can begin to build the financial resources this year that will be needed for initial expenses of the call process. However, **the challenge to achieve and sustain a budget that includes a full-time pastor begins now**. It begins with each one of us looking at our personal stewardship with the question: Can I/we do more to support the life, work and mission of Spirit of Joy Lutheran Church?

There is no "one size fits all" response to this question. I have always believed that **our response is something we bring to our Lord in prayer**, asking the Spirit to guide our thoughts, our conscience, and our willingness to do our part. If we believe that Spirit has already prepared the future for the congregation of Spirit of Joy to walk in, we also need to believe that Spirit has cultivated and equipped us to make that future possible. As a great hymn encourages, "*Take it to the Lord in prayer*." Stewardship is business with the Lord.

In the coming months your Council, and a newly established **Financial Task Group**, will present information that will help you understand where we are now as a congregation, and where we need to be as we enter the call process. I thank them for their work and willingness to share this financial picture with you, and I thank each one of you for your wonderful support of Spirit of Joy in the past. Now, have work to do – in a Spirit of Joy!
